She has exhibited extensively in the U.S. and internationally and was included in the 2008 Whitney Biennial. Solo exhibitions include *The Unloved* at the Groeninge Museum, Bruges, Belgium, *The Alien's Guide to the Ruins of Washington DC* at the Corcoran Gallery of Art, Washington DC, *The Nudist Museum* at the Bass Museum, Miami Beach, FL, *Ruins are More Beautiful* at the Center for Contemporary Art, Warsaw, Poland, *Mirror* at the Pennsylvania Academy of Art and *A Whitney for the Whitney at Philip Morris* at the Whitney Museum at Altria.
