



Diane James, CAE serves as executive director of Women's Transportation Seminar, a professional society for women in the transportation industry. From 2004-06, she was executive director of the Jacobs Institute of Women's Health, a health policy organization based in Washington DC. Prior to joining the Institute, James was executive director for Women in Cable Telecommunications in Chantilly VA, from 2003-04.

She served as Vice President for Strategic Alliances and Partnerships at the American Society for Association Executives for three years, where she was responsible for creating an innovative partnership program between ASAE and its 63 state and local allied societies. She succeeded to ASAE after serving for three years as the executive director of the Georgia Society of Association Executives in Atlanta.

Her background in association financial and administrative management includes six years as the Director of Financial and Member Services of the American Association of Occupational Health Nurses in Atlanta; business director of the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, and director of business and finance for the Woman's National Democratic Club, both in Washington DC. She holds a bachelor's degree in business administration and human resource management from Oglethorpe University in Atlanta and achieved the Certified Association Executive (CAE) designation in 1997.

She speaks and writes frequently on topics of association management including leadership, governance, finance, administration, technology, human resources, and women's issues. Her presentation credits include regular sessions conducted by ASAE on topics of leadership and management as well as to associations and community groups. She periodically conducts workshops and planning sessions for associations and serves as volunteer treasurer of Spark the Wave, a nonprofit organization in Washington DC devoted to helping teenagers develop leadership skills for community service.
