She has been very involved in the local and national transportation industry, having served in various positions with WTS, both at the chapter level and with the international organization. She is currently serving as WTS International Vice President. In her hometown of Scottsdale, AZ, Terry was appointed by the city's manager and council as a City Transportation Commissioner and also serves as Communications Committee Chair for the Arizona Transit Association.

Gruver has provided a wide variety of communications and public involvement expertise on numerous transportation and related projects.
