Susan serves as the Director of the Transportation Business Group's North American Highway/Bridge business at CH2M HILL. She is responsible for establishing the North America highway/bridge strategy; stewarding federal, state, county, municipal, and private client relationships; identifying/analyzing market trends; and fostering the development of new technologies and services to meet clients' needs. She is nationally recognized as an expert in surface transportation development and a strong advocate for safety initiatives to reduce fatalities, alternative project delivery methods, and transportation funding mechanisms to ensure continued investment in the nation's infrastructure.

Prior to joining CH2MHILL she was with the Nevada Department of Transportation for 28 years. Where in her last 6 served as the NDOT Director. With her NDOT team she formed the Department into a responsive and customer friendly agency through broader communications strategies both within and externally to give, receive and follow-up with information, and to improve transparency and show accountability to the Nevada Governor, Legislature and public. Her other passion areas are reducing fatalities, implementing research findings to new technology, project delivery efficiency, opening communication, and bringing flexibility to new legislation and policies to embrace the differences of states. While at the Nevada DOT she initiated many changes to enhance NDOT in the state and country; including innovative contracting methods, implementing studies for new transportation financing, leadership training for middle management and new employees, and partnering with contractors and project stakeholders.

Susan is actively involved and recognized in many national transportation organizations: AASHTO (American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials), TRB (Transportation Research Board), and WTS (Women's Transportation Seminar). She has been part of the leadership of committees on research, safety, and management training. She is past president of AASHTO, the first woman to hold the position. She was also on the TRB Executive Board. She has participated in the development of national policy that addresses states' needs and issues, and presented before Congress on behalf of states on such issues.
