White shared some interesting statistics with us about how the work-life balance has changed over the last few generations. With more women working outside the home, our family-life expectations are changing. The table below shows how our focus has changed.

Eat dinner together	91%	80%
At home after school	78%	61%
Attend religious services together	72%	59%
Attend children's special events (sports, plays, etc.)	76%	90%

An Update from the New Leader Keith Parker, CEO, Charlotte Area Transit System

Keith Parker, new Director of Public Transportation and CEO of CATS, joined us in May to give an update on one of the fastest growing transit systems in the country. CATS is being recognized nationwide for its growth and success in the transit industry.

Since the passage of the half-cent sales tax in 1998, there has been tremendous growth to Charlotte's transit system. The system expansion has included:

- Expanded service hours.
- Greater service frequency.
- More local routes.
- Countywide ADA service.
- Regional expansion with express bus services.
- Improved safety and reliability.



In November 2007, Charlotte entered a new era in public transportation with the opening of North Carolina's first light rail line, the LYNX Blue Line. People are enjoying using the LYNX Blue Line generating over 13,000 daily trips, exceeding our first year projections by over 40 percent. In addition to attracting riders, the City of Charlotte has been successful in combining development with transit. The South Corridor has generated over \$1.5 billion in actual and proposed corridor development through 2011. "Consistently high ridership numbers plus the amount of development happening along the corridor demonstrate the project's benefits to the community," said Parker. "The LYNX Blue Line is a milestone project for the region that will have positive impacts on our quality of life, now and in the future."

CATS is continuing to move forward with additional rapid transit projects. The LYNX Purple Line (North Corridor) and LYNX Blue Line Extension (Northeast Corridor) are currently in the preliminary engineering phase. The West Corridor will see enhanced buses in operation in 2009. CATS is coordinating with NCDOT on the Independence Boulevard widening project to ensure preservation of right of way for the LYNX Silver Line (Southeast Corridor); a future bus rapid transit or light rail transit line. City Council recently approved funding for an Economic Impact Study if the Center City Streetcar Corridor, which is currently underway. The streetcar line would provide an east-west connection, from Rosa Parks Place on Beatties Ford Road to the Eastland Transit Community Center

In addition to the rapid transit corridors, CATS is growing in other areas as well. Improvements have continued for the local and express bus routes. Studying the routes to increase service frequency and add additional buses where needed is done on a continuous basis. Additional transit centers are being designed for construction. The art-in-transit division continues to expand and has become much more visible.

Two Charlotte Metro Chapter officers attended this year's WTS Annual Conference in Atlanta, Georgia – Kim

Bereis, Chapter President, and Kelly Goforth, Chapter Vice-President. The conference, titled "Transportation Crossroads," was held May 14-16th, 2008. Attendees were inspired and informed by women transportation leaders from across the country.



Topics ranged from international transportation issues to sessions on leadership and diversity. We heard about the challenges of growth from China to Montreal, land use and transit as part of the sustainability solution, and the need for infrastructure investment in the U.S. to support megaregions. Sessions on leadership discussed how to be a good manager and the characteristics of leaders. One speaker described leadership as Courage + Competence.

One of the most interesting sessions was Marilyn Moats Kennedy, who spoke in an engaging and often hilarious way about the generational differences in the workplace, including what motivates "Baby Boomers" versus the "Netsters".
