PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

Local Committee of 21 Roads Initiative (February 2009) Ned Curran, Chair, Committee of 21

The Committee of 21 is chaired by Ned Curran, who joined us on February 24, 2009 to provide an update on the committee's work. The Committee of 21 was formed to bring diverse stakeholders together to prioritize area road needs, identify long-term funding options and advocate for funding. The committee's members represent a demographic and geographic balance that includes residents of Mecklenburg County towns, neighborhood activists, environmental advocates and the business community.



Curran reported that the mantra "Let's get something done this time" set the stage for the discussion and outcome for the Committee. Studies show the top site selection factor of corporate decision making is highway accessibility. So, the Committee's focus is to improve roads and reduce congestion.

Guiding Principles

- 1. Must be politically viable
- 2. Strive to relate fees to users
- 3. Ensure that road decisions are appropriately consistent with public transportation system and adopted land use plans
- 4. Provide accountability and transparency while using limited political influence
- 5. Seek to leverage dollars
- 6. Encourage public/private partnerships

Four Financing Options

- 1. Vehicle registration fee Maintenance of local roads
- 2. Sales tax Construction of roads
- 3. Tolls on interstates Completion and expansion of freeways
- 4. Vehicle miles traveled fee Future road funding source

WTS Charlotte Metro Chapter Annual Meeting (January 2009)



Walter Turner, Author and Historian MARK YOUR CALENDARS!


On May 19, 2009, come hear Walter Turner, Historian at the North
