Heer Clear / DURmegeddon

In 2013, Caltrans District 11 and the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) developed a public awareness campaign encouraging motorists to "Steer Clear" of two major freeways during required closures due to construction activities. As a result, traffic was reduced by 13 percent during the I-15 closure and by an estimated 50 percent during the I-805 closure. Work was completed and the freeways reopened in time for the morning commute.

Innovative Transportation Folutions Award Transit & Roadway Project



Interstate 805/Carroll Canyon Road Extension Project

The Interstate 805/Carroll Canyon Road Extension Project constructed two miles of carpool lanes on I-805, built a Direct access Ramp (DAR) at Carroll Canyon Road, added a bus priority lane for future Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) on I-805, and created a new access road for nearby businesses. The project was a partnership with Caltrans District 11, Caltrans Office of Bridge Design – South, the FHWA, and the City of San Diego.

Innovative Transportation Solutions Award Alternative Modes & Active Transportation



Fanta Te Pedestrian Underpass

The Santa Fe Pedestrian Underpass project improves pedestrian access, circulation, and safety across the San Diego portion of the busy Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) rail corridor. The project was a partnership between the City of Encinitas, SANDAG, NCTD, and Caltrans.
