

WTS - Maine Chapter High School Scholarship

WTS fosters the development of women and girls in the transportation field by encouraging bright new professionals and students to undertake technical careers in the area of transportation. One way this is accomplished is by awarding the WTS – Maine High School Scholarship to young women pursuing undergraduate studies in science, technology, engineering, or math and considering a career in transportation. Please see below for additional information about careers in transportation.

WTS – Maine Chapter works to make a difference in our communities by offering this scholarship to encourage highly motivated young women to explore exciting careers that will change the face of the transportation industry.

This year WTS – Maine Chapter is offering up to three High School Scholarships in the amounts of \$1,000 to \$2,000. One award will be reserved for an applicant who is Black, Indigenous, or Person of Color (BIPOC). The minimum criteria for selection are:

- a. Applicant must be a female high school senior in the State of Maine or must have graduated from a high school in the State of Maine within the last year.
- b. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- c. Currently studying math, science, and technology.
- d. Considering a career in a transportation-related field.

Applications must be submitted through the local WTS – Maine Chapter. Typed documents preferred. Scholarships are competitive, and selection is based on the applicant's specific transportation goals, academic record, leadership roles, and extracurricular activities. If the individuals providing the recommendation would prefer, they can mail their recommendations directly to: Amanda Taylor at the address above.
- **IV. Personal Statement**: Include a statement that addresses the following: Describe a situation where you have demonstrated leadership (academically or non-academically) and what that experience taught you. Describe what transportation means to you and why transportation is an important career choice. The personal statement should not exceed 500 words or two pages. *Typed document preferred, please attach to application*.
