

On September 1, WTS GNY continued our Learn From a Leader series with Gillian Blake, Principal-Infrastructure at Arup. Gillian shared her experiences from her 29 year career, which has spanned across 4 continents and her multitude of roles. Gillian has worked on projects which included strategic advice, design and project management, multidisciplinary design coordination, detailed and scheme design. Gillian imparted her knowledge when it came to running projects, working with others successfully and how she navigated career with all the different places she worked in and the various roles she has held. Moving around the world kept Gillian busy and happy, both personally and professionally. Some of the key takeaways was what she thought the 3 most important qualities of leadership are. The first quality was teamwork. Gillian explained what it took to work on a team successfully. Speaking up for others on the team if you see they are not being listened to. The second quality was taking on opportunities when they come to you or reaching out to people you know when looking for opportunities. The third quality is having flexibility. Gillian was always doing work and taking on positions that she might not have planned on doing in her career. Gillian mentioned how certain positions she took on allowed her to develop and grow because she was put into positions where she could grow skills and develop strategies that weren't explored before. Gillian gave great advice regarding stating one's case allows you to put yourself out there and get noticed. She recommended not being afraid to reach out to people that you know when it comes to getting various positions.
