With over 20 attendees, WTS San Diego was able to raise a total of \$275 for the WTS San Diego Foundation. Lunch & Learn with MCTC and Burns & McDonnell

The first WTS San Diego Lunch and Learn for 2021 was held virtually in April and guests had the opportunity to hear from two of our corporate sponsors: Mid-Coast Transit Constructors (MCTC) and Burns & McDonnell.

Ketty Avila and Amber Linger from MCTC, a joint venture comprised of Stacy and Witbeck, Herzog and Skanska, began the program by discussing the Mid-Coast Corridor Expansion Project in San Diego. Ketty Avila, a Stations Engineer on the project, explained the challenges that this contractor has faced during construction such as the 300 Contracts Services (material agreements, professional services, and subcontracts) and 24,125 RFI's/Submittals/Transmittals. During 2020, the most stringent mandates were followed to implement MCTC Covid Law 'Be Proactive Not Reactive" including onsite testing, handwashing stations, and a zero-tolerance policy requiring cooperation with crews, subs, and vendors. The MCTC team coordinated with 296 Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) throughout the project and, as of 2021, they have committed \$223 million to DBE firms. Ketty and Amber shared a DBE success story of Leinaia's Transportation, a small woman-owned business that initially received a \$575,000 contract in May 2015 after attending several small business outreach and workshop events hosted by SANDAG and MCTC. Leinaia's Transportation now has nearly \$10 million in contracts with this project, allowing for the firm to expand capacity with new equipment purchases.

Next, we heard from Shari Cannon-Mackey, an Environmental Planner/NEPA Lead for the Transportation Market in Austin, TX at Burns & McDonnell. With over 30 years of experience leading the NEPA process, Shari shared her expertise in early coordination during the project decision-making process and strategies to minimize risk. She provided an extensive overview of the NEPA process and the recent July 2020 "NEPA Modernization." Some of the tools she discussed to minimize risk included early stakeholder identification, communication engagement strategies, addressing misconceptions, identifying project champions, and building long-term relationships. Thank you to our speakers and all the participants who made this program a success!


This year we collected responses from 77 WTS team members – a big thank you to all of you who completed the survey!




