WTS-LA MISSION UNSTOPPABLE COMMITTEE FOCUS

Transportation YOU

Transportation YOU brings real-world transportation experience to girls aged 13-18 through dynamic working professionals, and that makes the transportation industry come alive for these young women. Through the dedicated, innovative work of 2019-2020 co-chairs, Foothill Transit Director of Facilities **Sharlane Bailey** and Caltrans Deputy District 7 Director for Sustainability and Innovation **Barbara Marquez**, Transportation YOU delivered on that mission.

The Transportation YOU Adopt-A-School program includes Westchester, Dorsey, and Azusa High Schools. The committee visited these schools - in person in 2019 and virtually in 2020 - to present to a targeted group of young women interested in STEM. They discussed career paths in transportation, gave out \$38,000 in scholarships, and held two annual Empowerment Day summits. Empowerment Day brings the schools together to provide students with key insights to access the transportation field, navigate the workplace and academia as a woman, and overcome commonly-encountered obstacles.











Mentorship and Professional Development

Pairing early and mid-career women with established senior transportation professionals, the WTS-LA Mentorship Program provides invaluable one-on-one guidance and knowledge transfer for those looking to take their careers to the next level. In 2019-2020, under co-chairs AECOM Transportation Planner Lynn Feng and Fehr & Peers Transportation Planner Rachel Om, the program helped both protégés and mentors gain greater understanding of their careers, the industry, and their lives. The committee held programs to discuss perspectives on public and private sector careers, interpersonal communication, public speaking, writing, and negotiating skills.

Similarly, the committee's professional development programs sought to practically and meaningfully help WTS-LA members develop themselves and their careers for the advancement of both.

The Metro Managers Panel, moderated by Heather Anderson, PE, Senior Engineer with HNTB, and a panel consisting of Lucy Delgadillo, Transportation Planning Manager; Tham Nguyen, Office of Extraordinary Innovation Senior Director; Ayda Safaei, Community Relations Director; Jenny Cristales-Cevallos, Transportation Planning Senior Manager; Nancy Saravia, Transportation Planning Manager; and Kate Amissah, Regional Rail Senior Engineer. Panelists spoke about their career path, pivotal opportunities, and work-life balance. Interactive break-out groups covered diversity in the workplace, public speaking, creative problem solving and lessons learned, and career paths.

In 2020, a second program, A Discussion on the Job Search and Career Development During Uncertain Times, provided valuable insight to navigating networking, the job search, and career development while in-person activities were on hold. The panel included speakers from several firms who are involved with recruitment and career development.









College Outreach

Darlene Gonzalez-Szabo, 2019-2020 WTS-LA College Outreach Committee Chair and Mott MacDonald Transportation Planner, sees college outreach as critical to the chapter's long-term success. College outreach also keeps the chapter in close touch with current perspectives and outlooks in transportation, while helping the next generation of transportation professionals.

Pre-pandemic, the committee visited UCLA, Cal Poly Pomona, Loyola Marymount, and USC to inform students about scholarship and networking opportunities. In March 2019, the team paired transportation professionals with college students for a résumé workshop and industry-specific feedback and mentoring. At the annual student mixer in May 2019, corporate partners sponsored booths for over 40 college students to avail them of job opportunities and upcoming projects. In October 2019, the team hosted a construction site tour for 10 college students of Metro's signature Regional Connector Project, bringing them into a station construction site and subway tunnel. Then, the pandemic hit.

Taking pandemic challenges head on, Gonzalez-Szabo and her team created a program called *Overcoming Obstacles in Virtual Environments*, an event that once again embraced a mix of college students and transportation professionals, including LAWA Strategic Planning Manager Tina Backstrom, CivilTec Engineer Gretel Ochoa-Nhac, Mott MacDonald Systems Engineer Brianna Pearlman, Metrolink Human Resources Manager Belinda Varela, and Stantec Systems Project Engineer Victoria Osaji. Sharing experiences on everything from seeking mentors to leveraging technology during the pandemic, the event then split into breakout rooms to foster in-depth exploration of individual topics. The final program of 2020 took a small group of 10 students on a virtual visit with Caltrans District 7 staff to learn about their Liberty Canyon Wildlife Crossing Project, the largest of its kind in the country.

Gonzalez-Szabo knows the value of what she and her team present firsthand. "I'm so very proud to have accomplished so much with my college outreach team. WTS-LA is a phenomenal organization that brought me in when I was a graduate student myself. And I hope that the students I've met through this program continue to grow and impress us all as they move into the professional world."





Corporate Relations Committee and the WTS-LA Scholarships Program

The WTS-LA Corporate Relations Committee and the WTS-LA Scholarships Program are inextricably linked. While the Corporate Relations Committee provides funding to the chapter beyond scholarships, its most significant function is without doubt the money it raises to foster the next generation of transportation professionals through scholarships. And this was an extraordinarily successful period by any measure.

Through a combination of corporate partners, individual corporate donors, and individual donors, WTS-LA set a record by awarding \$200,000 in scholarships at the WTS-LA Scholarship and Awards programs in 2019 and 2020. And those donors included both corporations and public-sector agencies like AECOM, Berg & Associates, BYD North America, Environmental Science Associates, Fehr & Peers, Hill International, HNTB, Jacobs, Mott MacDonald, PGH Wong, Psomas, SENER, Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), Stantec, Toole Design, TY Lin, and WSP. But the impetus behind such selfless generosity—the students—is what drives everyone involved.

Hailing from myriad backgrounds and circumstances, WTS-LA scholarship winners range from first-time-in-their-family college students to multiple-degree candidates from the nation's most elite transportation education institutions, from high school standouts to PhD candidates on the very cutting edge of transportation—and every status in between. The WTS-LA Scholarships Program and the Corporate Relations Committee help make their dreams a reality by providing desperately needed funding for their education.

WTS-LA Chapter Scholarships Chair and SCAG Senior Regional Planner Hannah Brunelle adds, "We also expanded the community college scholarship, giving out two \$4,500 scholarships, and we created two new \$6,000 back-to-school scholarships for students continuing their education and/or working professionals going to back to school. We also engaged new first-time sponsors and donation partners to meet our \$100,000 annual goal. So, it's been a very successful time for the Scholarships Program and the young women we've been able to help."



Women of the Year

Each year, WTS-LA honors a woman who serves as an outstanding role model while significantly contributing to the advancement of women and minorities in transportation. She must be a leader who has made "an outstanding contribution" to the transportation industry and has "advanced the reputation and credibility of women in transportation." In truth, it's a tall order. Fortunately, the exemplary women shaping Southern California transportation provide a very advanced, stellar pool of candidates.

In July 2019, **Cynthia Guidry, PE** became the director of Long Beach International Airport. Crowning a quarter-century-plus aviation career largely at Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA), Guidry is known for her vision, smarts, innovation, and absolute mastery at delivering massive, complex projects. Her work at LAWA is legendary. But she didn't stop there. She's also been extremely active in WTS for almost her entire career, serving on the WTS-LA board for more than 16 years, as well as in numerous other capacities for the chapter. In many ways, she embodies the WTS-LA mission perfectly. So, it was no surprise to anyone when the chapter named her the 2019 WTS-LA Woman of the Year.

Jeanet Owens, PE, Metro Senior Executive Officer for Program Management and Regional Rail Metro, manages a program of more than \$5 billion in capital improvements. And for more than 25 years, she, too, has demonstrated absolute mastery when it comes to overseeing enormous, complex, and highly sensitive signature projects. It is an extraordinary record. But for her, that's not enough. She's also an accredited LEED professional and a lieutenant and eight-year veteran in the U.S. Navy Reserve Civil Engineering Corps. She's also a strong believer in WTS-LA and its mission, devoting considerable time, energy, and effort into helping the chapter and its members. She, too, was a natural selection for the 2020 WTS-LA Woman of the Year.
