# **MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: Deborah Carter McCoy**

WTS Minnesota's Member Spotlight is a newsletter feature to share your stories on what being a WTS member means to you. This month's story features Deborah Carter McCoy from Environmental Initiatives.

#### How did you come to join WTS?

WTS offered me the opportunity to have science, policy and planning discussions in a women-led environment. I was working in a male-only office and was not regularly included in conversations about transportation planning despite my professional background and interests.

#### How have you gotten involved in the organization?

I was very active in the Chicago chapter of WTS serving on the Membership Committee. During that time I participated in writing personal thank you notes to members, membership reminders, packing and bulk mailing of branded cloth bags, and hosting happy hours for members.



#### Why do you stay active?

My WTS membership allows me to stay connected to others and to attend events which provide me educational and social opportunities. I am also an active member of the Transportation Research Forum and National Association of Railway Women. Each organization offers me connections to an industry which is no longer my primary work but remains a significant interest. WTS, as a female-focused and all mode organization, offers the widest range of opportunity and professional relationships.

#### What value has being a member had to you/your career?

I have met some very interesting women during events – especially young women new to the workforce. The most memorable conversations have been with engineers working on major construction projects, including O'Hare Airport expansion, and a young woman working in a Chicago rail yard as a mechanical engineering intern. My work in communications is always informed by the technical experts and stakeholders, including community members, and the opportunity to connect with women leading in their industries is a fantastic way to learn about major projects within a chapter service area. During WTS events I can ask questions and learn about nuances that allow me to become a stronger communicator or think about projects in new ways.

#### Any words of encouragement on why someone should join?

As a current Minnesota and former Chicago chapter member, I find that each offers excellent opportunities to meet women who are changing the face of transportation. Attending the Dale Street Bridge celebration in August 2021 with a friend and former colleague, I was reminded how often women lead but are still not given credit for that leadership. There is work to do and showing up is important.
