

Four MTA Employees Join Women's WTS -**GNY Popular Mentoring Program**

Four MTA employees have been tapped to participate in the annual mentoring program run by the Greater New York Chapter of Women's Transportation Seminar (WTS-GNY).

Three of the MTA participants were chosen as mentors, and the fourth is an apprentice.

The yearlong program matches female leaders in transportation with up-and-coming professionals. The pairs meet independently every month to discuss career goals and development, and they also attend monthly evening group meetings to develop professional skills and learn from diverse speakers and from each other.

Donna Tafro, assistant director of Data Center Operation Administration in the MTA's IT Department and secretary of WTS, told MTA Today that the employees are:

Kat Lawrence, an analyst with Strategic Initiatives, part of the Office of the Executive Vice President at New York City Transit. Lawrence is one of 10 apprentices in the program;

Lisa Schreibman, director of strategic planning in the Operations Planning Department at NYCT;

Patricia Lodge, vice president of human resources at NYCT; and Eve Michel, program executive, senior vice president and chief architect at MTA Capital Construction.

The program, which began in 2001, is oversubscribed, turning away both potential apprentices as well as mentors, Tafro said. "People want to be part of it once they know about it," she noted. Apprentice applicants are required to have at least five years of



professional experience.

Mentors are selected either through an online application or by recommendation of someone within WTS. "We look for women professionals with a substantial part of their career spent in transportation and with management experience," Tafro said. She added: "Mentors find the experience as rewarding as the mentees."

Two MTA participants - a mentor and an apprentice - discussed the program with MTA Today.

"It was a really great experience, and I recommend it to others," said Carmen Oleksinski, an associate analyst in NYCT's Strategic Initiatives Group, who participated as an apprentice in 2015.

"And I'm not alone in feeling that way. Towards the end of the year, I helped set up a survey to find out how people felt about the program. Over three quarters of them said they highly recommended it."

Malinda Foy, director of research and communication at Bridges and Tunnels, is a former mentor.

"The program attracts a competitive, impressive set of apprentices," Foy said. "They have seized on the opportunity to focus on their careers, their goals and to do great things. That's the biggest benefit - it's an opportunity to get to know yourself and focus on what is important to you."

Noted Oleksinski: "All of us were interested in making deliberate choices about our careers rather than waiting for things to happen for us. We were excited to define our paths forward."

Coaches from outside the program are brought in for professional training twice during the mentorship, and there's also a social event in August. Participants attend a "graduation" where the WTS-GNY Woman of the Year (honored at the WTS-GNY annual gala) is available for one-on-one conversation with mentors and apprentices.

The program continues informally for many participants even after it officially ends.

"Many mentors and apprentices stay in touch after the program has ended," Foy said, while Oleksinski noted: "A group of about five of us get together informally every few months. And we know we can approach each other for help if a specific issue arises."


