Member in the News: Clarelle DeGraffe



Clarelle DeGraffe becomes the Director of Rail Transit and General Manager of PATH

On March 25, 2019, after having served as deputy director for the least four years, Clarelle DeGraffe officially began her new role as Director of Rail Transit and General Manager of PATH. She is the first woman to lead the railroad in its 57-year history. Clarelle will be responsible for carrying out PATH's critical mission of moving nearly 300,000 people daily across the Hudson safely and effectively. She will oversee the department's ambitious capital program, including the ongoing replacement of equipment and rebuilding of tunnels severely damaged during Superstorm Sandy as well as the completion of the remaining phases of modernizing its century-old signal system. She will also spearhead initiatives aimed at future capacity growth, reliability and enhanced customer experience.

Clarelle has nearly 30 years of experience in the field of transportation, project management and construction management. Over the years, Clarelle has accumulated broad technical knowledge in the design and construction of transportation infrastructure, combined with the development of her outstanding strengths as a leader and creative problem solverv. She is able to establish rapport with diverse groups ranging from executive management to field laborers and maintenance



staff.

Clarelle is a recipient of the 2008 Harlem Black Achievers Award, a 2013 Honoree in Professional Women in Construction and a 2018 recipient of a Congressional Certificate of Merit for her community service in Southeast Queens.



The highly anticipated Glass Ceiling report has been published

In 2016, the WTS Greater New York (WTS-GNY) Chapter created a Glass Ceiling Committee (GCC) to review and quantify the challenges faced by women in the region. The WTS-GNY GCC is comprised of women from private sector companies and public entities. This report summarizes the results of a literature review and survey of relevant demographic profiles, policies, and programs. It also provides case studies and recommended practices.

In 2017, WTS-GNY sent a survey to public government entities, public corporations, private corporations, and non-profit organizations in the New York and New Jersey Metropolitan area.

Key findings from the survey include:

- Out of the 162 employers that received the survey, 29 responded, representing a response rate of 18%. Two responses were excluded from result summary.
- On average, women comprised 20% of employees.
- 13 participating organizations had 30% or fewer seniorlevel positions and twelve mid-level positions filled by women.
- Only six organizations had a 50-50 gender split at the senior level. Five of these same organizations had a 50% or better representation of women in mid-level positions.
- Only nine participating organizations had a mentoring program. An average of 40% of participants in those mentoring programs were women.
- While 17 of the participating organizations have an affirmative action plan, only 14 conducted diversity training and 12 have dedicated staff overseeing their diversity efforts.
- Most (19) of participating organizations did not have a women's network group or committee. The eight that did were evenly split between public and private sector.
- The survey asked respondents how often seven issues were raised in their recruiting and/or exit interviews. The top three issues raised "often" were: (1) compensation; (2) flexible work schedules; and (3) work culture.Save the date for a panel on May 7th, 2019 to discuss the results.
