2018 Learn from a Leader: Madeleine Ehrlich McDonnell September 12th, 2018 | 05:30 PM - 07:30 PM

Madeleine Ehrlich McDonnell is the Director of Special Projects for the Office of the COO at the New York City Department of Transportation (NYCDOT). The COO's office oversees the agency's operating divisions which are responsible for the City's bridges, roads and highways, sidewalks and pedestrian ramps, street lights and signals, street safety projects, the Staten Island Ferry, and NYCDOT's fleet of vehicles and equipment. Ms. McDonnell provides strategic direction on a broad portfolio of high profile operational projects that span multiple divisions and city agencies. This includes the multibillion-dollar BQE reconstruction project, a major expansion of the City's pedestrian ramp construction and upgrade program, and launching New York City's first municipal public parking mobile app. Ms. McDonnell also manages NYCDOT's employee town hall initiative - a series of town hall-style events for agency divisions and cross cutting employee groups, such as "Women in the Field," hosted by Commissioner Polly Trottenberg. Delivering a New New York

On June 5th, 2018, Design Build Institute of America's Liberty Region (DBIA) and WTS Greater New York (WTS GNY) co-hosted *Delivering a New New York* at the Yale Club. In this symposium, industry leaders discussed how Design-Build has been used in New York State and the benefits, challenges as well as the lessons learned using this delivery method. The program included two panel discussions and a keynote presentation from Ali Chaudhri, New York State Deputy Secretary for Transportation.

The event sold out weeks in advance. The 166 attendees represented designers and builders from the private sector, as well as representatives from public agencies and professional organizations. Six members of the WTS GNY leadership team volunteered for the event and informed attendees about WTS during breakfast and lunch, including Alexa Gangemi (Speaker/Facilitator), Carla Simon-Artis (Membership Table), Yvonne Lopez-Diaz, Portia Henry, Bibi Khan, and Sheriza Majid (Check-In).

DBIA's mission is to ensure success for owners and those in the industry by providing tools and education. To achieve this, they provide educational materials, organize events like this one, and offer Design-Build Done Right training to owners. In her



remarks, Lisa Washington, Executive Director/CEO of Design-Build Institute of America, opened with a description of DBIA and how the organization started its lobbying efforts in New York in 2009. Governor Cuomo's support in 2011, including his request for authorization in his first state budget, was "the beginning of a New New York."

"Design-Build is now the fastest growing delivery method in the nation, accounting for almost half of all design and construction," Ms. Washington remarked and cited market research by FMI Corporation, predicting an estimated 30 percent growth in transportation and wastewater-related construction over the next three years in Design-Build. Manufacturing and transportation projects will be the largest share of the growth.

Volunteers will work in a team for one municipality and should have experience in one or more of the following areas: land use planning, pedestrian and bicycle planning, retail analysis and economic development, parking management, and transportation and traffic management. - **Dunellen:** The town of Dunellen has a well-established downtown along New Jersey Route 28, which is called North Avenue and Bound Brook Road in the Borough. The NJ TRANSIT commuter station is near the intersection of North Avenue and South Washington Avenue. As part of the Raritan Valley Line it provides access to Newark and New York City.
- The Watsessing Avenue Station in Bloomfield: The Watsessing Avenue Station in Bloomfield, part of NJ TRANSIT's Montclair-Boonton Line, serves residential and former industrial neighborhoods near the border of Bloomfield and East Orange. With travel times of less than 10 minutes to Broad Street Station in Newark and approximately 30 minutes to Penn Station New York, the frequent rail service provides access to regional employment, cultural and retail opportunities.
- City of Passaic: Main Avenue in the City of Passaic ishighlyactiveandservesasthe nucleusoftheCityofPassaic'scentralbusinessdistrict,whichextendsapproximately half a milefromPenningtonAvenue toMonroe Street. The relocation of a nearby NJ TRANSIT bus transfer facility serving local and commuter routes presents an opportunity for better integration into the fabric of Main Avenue.
