
Call for Volunteers - 2017 WTS International Conference

WTS-GNY is delighted to announce that the Greater NY Chapter will host the 2017 International Conference. WTS members and industry colleagues will gather at the Brooklyn Marriott to network and to listen to industry experts and trendsetters.

We are seeking volunteers to lead and participate on the committees listed below.

- Technical tours sets up three to four tours showcasing New York and New Jersey transport facilities. Once the list is decided, the committee chair spearheads the arrangements for the tours with facility owners and handles the logistics.
- Technical sessions develops four program tracks, each of which reflects the conference theme. The committee suggests moderators and panelists for ultimate approval by WTS International. Once approved, the committee invites speakers; confirms attendance; and assists the moderators in creating agendas and talking points.
- Poster session distributes an invitation for session abstracts. The committee communicates specs for the poster display and coordinates with the WTS International event staff and poster exhibitors.
- Silent Auction solicits auction items from all WTS chapters and coordinates the receipt and display of the items, and runs the auction during the conference, including the collection of payments and distribution of items at the appropriate time.
- Hospitality staffs the various registration, speaker, reservation desks at the conference.
- Blue Ribbon compiles the list for WTS International approval and once approved; invites members; and assists with the blue ribbon reception as necessary.
- Fundraising coordinates fundraising targets with WTS
 International; develops the levels of sponsorship;
 develops the ask; and follows up with targets to secure the
 fundraising goals.

Veronique "Ronnie" Hakim to become MTA New York City Transit President on December 28, 2015!



Exerpt from the MTA press release:

On Tuesday November 17, MTA Chairman and CEO Thomas F. Prendergast announced the appointment of Veronique "Ronnie" Hakim as the eighth

permanent president of the agency, which moves more than eight million daily customers on subways, buses, Staten Island Railway and paratransit service.

Hakim is a career transportation professional who returns to the MTA after an earlier 23-year career at the agency. For the past year and a half she has served as the executive director of NJ Transit. She previously served four years as executive director of the New Jersey Turnpike Authority.

"Our transit network is the lifeblood of the entire region, and I am glad to welcome [Hakim] back to New York City Transit and to entrust her with the responsibility of ensuring safe and reliable service even as ridership grows every month," Prendergast said.

In her time at the MTA, Hakim served as special counsel for New York City Transit as well as executive vice president and general counsel at MTA Capital Construction, where she provided senior management with policy and legal advice on megaprojects such as the Second Avenue Subway, East Side Access and the 7 train extension to Hudson Yards. She holds a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Rochester and a juris doctorate degree from the Pace University School of Law.

"Having spent more than two decades of my life at the MTA, I am deeply honored to have the opportunity to lead New York City Transit at a time when surging ridership is affecting every element of its operations,"





Hakim said. "Subway and bus customers have high expectations for the network they rely on every day, and I look forward to meeting their expectations of safety, reliability and quality at New York City Transit."

The successful candidate will be an integral member of a unique, dynamic, and growing organization and contribute research; develop and implement programs and projects related to improving transportation in cities; administer grants; and build organizational capacity.

Responsibilities

As part of a team, the program analyst will research issues, develop opportunities, and execute projects that promote sustainable urban mobility, with oversight from senior staff. Some projects may be executed through the use of program consultants with specialized subject matter expertise, who the program analyst must be qualified to oversee. The program analyst will also share responsibility for communicating TransitCenter's initiatives through articles, blog posts, and social media.

TransitCenter is a small but growing organization, so the program analyst may also be expected to play a hands-on role in operations and shoulder a portion of the organization's administrative and clerical duties as assigned.


The position is based in New York City. The salary range is \$55,000-\$70k commensurate with experience, with a competitive benefits package.
