

WTS-GNY 2019 Social Media Branding Webinar

Do you know what comes up when you Google yourself? What type of digital footprint do you have? What hashtags are you associated with? Is there a deliberate theme in content or do you have to do some fine-tuning to your social media brand? The"Social Media Branding" webinar hosted by Arch Street Communications (ASC) Founder and CEO Nora Madonick, was a rewarding and instructive opportunity to capitalize on the social media site Linkedin for productive and powerful professional development. In the course of the session, Rachel Adler, the lead presenter, shared a host of practical and insightful tips for using the platform:

* Best time to post on Linkedin? ASC recommends Wednesdays between 3:00 and 5:00 PM. But anytime between Tuesday and Thursday is also effective.

- * Linkedin users spend 9 to 17 minutes per day on the site.
- * "Innovative," "hardworking," "expert," and "transportation expert" are all words most used by men to describe themselves on LinkedIn. Women need to be employing these words significantly more.
- * 25 million LinkedIn profiles are viewed every day.
- * 1 in 3 professionals on the planet EARTH are on LinkedIn!

On February 19, 2019, **Zenobia L. Fields** will be joining the New Jersey Department of Transportation as the new **Director of Government & Community Relations**. As director, Zenobia will lead her team in planning, organizing and maintaining a comprehensive liaison program with the US Congressional delegation, state legislators, and other local elected officials to inform them of upcoming legislative changes, transportation projects and other transportation improvements.

Zenobia has 17 years of planning experience and has worked for the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority since 2007. She started as a principal planner and was entrusted with increasing responsibilities, ultimately serving as the department director of planning for more than six years. In this role, she has overseen 25 staff members and been responsible for regional planning programs in mobility, transportation, environmental and sustainability initiatives, systems planning, modeling and data, freight planning, as well as inter-agency planning collaboration.
