For the past sixty years, New Yorkers have relied on subway and bus for almost all their public transportation. But now the City of New York is pursuing

the possibility of adding a 14-mile light rail street car between Sunset Park, Brooklyn and Astoria, Queens. Known as the Brooklyn-Queens Connector, or BQX, it is expected to potentially serve as many as 50,000 people daily in a part of the city currently underserved by public transit.

Adam Giambrone, Director of the BQX Streetcar Project, an initiative of the NYC Economic Development Corporation, was the keynote speaker at this year's WTS GNY's fall dinner


