Scholarship recipient spotlight: Tra Vu

What scholarship did you receive and when?

I was awarded two scholarships from the WTS Greater NY chapter. They are: the Susan Miszkowicz Memorial Undergraduate



Scholarship in 2006 and Leonard Braun Memorial Graduate Scholarship in 2009.

What were you studying at the time you received your scholarship?

In 2006, I was pursuing B.S./M.S. dual degrees in Civil Engineering and Financial Engineering, respectively, at the Polytechnic University (now NYU-Poly). In 2009, I was in a dual M.S/ Ph.D. program in Transportation Planning and Engineering also at NYU-Poly.

Where has your journey taken you since receiving that scholarship?

After graduating in 2011, I joined Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. (GPI) as a transportation engineer/ simulation modeler and have been there since.

What do you do in your current role?

In my current role as the leader of the Simulation Modelling team at GPI, I have the privilege of working alongside a group of intelligent, ambitious, and vibrant young engineers. Together we modeled the first wireless Transit Signal Priority (TSP) system in New York City. We assisted the New York City Department of Transportation in defining the parameters and algorithm of the TSP system. The first corridor was deployed in the summer of 2013 in Lower Manhattan with resounding success. We're currently working on ten other such corridors.

I also enjoy being an educator and am continuing my academic involvement as an adjunct professor at NYU-Poly in Brooklyn.

What is it about the transportation industry that keeps you excited?

Transportation is the catalyst of social and economic growth and progress. While the field is not very glamorous, it has to adapt to a continuously changing climate in response to increased demand and evolving technology. Constantly evolving old and new issues coupled with rigid constraints present a tough challenge. Finding creative and simple solutions to those problems excites and motivates me.

How did your WTS scholarship help get you to where you are today?

The scholarships were a gateway for me to participate in the WTS community, where I was encouraged to hone my social skills; form valuable friendships; and learn from mentors.

Do you feel that WTS is a worthwhile organization?

Yes, WTS is able to attract a wide range of members, from both the private and public sectors, men and women, veteran members, as well as younger professionals and students. It offers a platform where members support each other's growth and success. WTS is certainly a worthwhile organization of which to be a part.


