Delivering a New New York

On June 5th, 2018, Design Build Institute of America's Liberty Region (DBIA) and WTS Greater New York (WTS GNY) co-hosted *Delivering a New New York* at the Yale Club. In this symposium, industry leaders discussed how Design-Build has been used in New York State (NYS) as well as the challenges encountered and lessons learned using this delivery method. The program, which included two panel discussions, also featured a keynote presentation by Ali Chaudhri, NYS Deputy Secretary for Transportation.

The event, which sold out weeks in advance, represented designers and builders from the private sector, as well as representatives from public agencies and professional organizations. Six members of the WTS GNY leadership team volunteered for the event and educated attendees about WTS during breakfast and lunch: Alexa Gangemi (Speaker/Facilitator), Carla Simon-Artis (Membership Table), Yvonne Lopez-Diaz, Portia Henry, Bibi Khan, and Sheriza Majid (Check-In).

DBIA's mission is to provide tools and education to ensure success for owners and those in the industry. To achieve this, the organization provides educational materials, organizes events like this one, and offers "Design-Build Done Right" training to owners. In her opening remarks, Lisa



Washington, Executive Director/CEO of Design-Build Institute of America, noted that DBIA started its lobbying efforts in New York in 2009. Governor Cuomo's support in 2011, including his request for authorization in his first state budget, was "the beginning of a New New York."

"Design-Build is now the fastest growing delivery method in the nation, accounting for almost half of all design and construction." Ms. Washington cited market research predicting an estimated 30 percent growth in transportation and wastewater sections over the next three years in Design-Build. Manufacturing and transportation projects will be the largest share of this growth.


NJDOT Commissioner Welcome Reception

On the evening of June 19th, WTS-GNY welcomed Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti back to New Jersey (NJ) in her new role as NJ Department of Transportation (NJDOT) commissioner. The event was held near department headquarters at the Grounds for Sculpture, a sculpture park and museum in Hamilton, New Jersey.

The turnout of approximately 100 attendees reflected the strong relationships the Commissioner has built over the years. From the dozen-plus NJ Turnpike employees, from her last leadership post in New Jersey, to the WTS International Executive Leaders who flew halfway across the country to celebrate the appointment of this inspiring leader, it was a highly celebratory event.

After an hour of networking, during which the Commissioner personally greeted many of the guests, it was time for the official welcome.

Zenobia Fields, WTS-GNY NJ vice president, began her remarks by recognizing WTS-GNY President Alex Gangemi as well as the NJ Events Committee who had organized the program. After acknowledging chapter members, Ms. Fields stated that



the Commissioner always has been a proponent of WTS and demonstrated one of the Commissioner's methods of support by asking all WTS members to raise their hands. Practically the entire room was filled with raised hands followed by great applause. It clearly was a fantastic opportunity to put in a plug for the WTS-GNY 2018 Annual Gala in October when the Commissioner will serve as master of ceremonies!

Ms. Fields, who said that she first met the Commissioner in March during Women's History month on a glass-ceiling panel, remarked that beyond the Commissioner's resume, she was impressed by what Ms. Gutierrez-Scaccetti had to say-about partnerships, professional development, bridge building and innovation. "It is appropriate that we are here among these sculpture installations to welcome the woman shaping the future of transportation for the state, Commissioner Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti," she observed.

The Commissioner was welcomed to the podium with a warm round of applause, and then delivered inspiring reflections on innovation, partnerships, non-traditional program delivery and mentorship. She also spoke about initiatives under the Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSMO) group in terms of innovation and its pending merger of the TSMO group under the Operations for streamlining as well as augmenting NJDOT staff with consultants. The Commissioner concluded her talk by highlighting the importance of promoting from within and of mentoring to support professional development. She then took questions about feasible contract duration and safety as a program emphasis area. In addition to sharing her vision for the department, she discussed her decision to return to New Jersey and her favorite sport teams.

The Commissioner stayed until the very end taking photos and mingling with colleagues, both old and new, and left everyone excited about the future of transportation in New Jersey.



In Memoriam: Pinson, President, Gilbert Tweed Associates

- American Public Transportation Association

Stephanie L. Pinson, 82, president of Gilbert Tweed International in New York City, a past chair of the APTA Business Member Board of Governors (BMBG) and a former member of the APTA Executive Committee, died June 18. She was a recipient of APTA's 2001 Outstanding Public Transportation Business Member Award. Pinson, who joined the company in 1981, directed its Transit and Transportation and Government Services practices. She also was a past trustee and past chair of the Mineta Transportation Institute.

"Stephanie Pinson has been a change agent through her relentless dedication and advocacy for the transit industry," said current BMBG Chair Jeff Wharton. "She has been an inspiration and has touched many lives throughout her career and her strong involvement with APTA."

"The industry mourns the loss of Stephanie. She was a well-respected and highly influential member of the public transportation family and she will be sorely missed," said APTA President and CEO Paul P. Skoutelas.

The BMBG endowed an American Public Transportation Foundation scholarship in Pinson's honor earlier this year.

During her tenure as BMBG chair, Pinson supported efforts to work with FTA to create international trade missions for APTA business members and to bring international delegations to the U.S., and worked on Buy America efforts. Her election broke ground for women in the public transit industry. She also encouraged business members to participate in APTA's governance activities.

During her tenure on the APTA Executive Committee, she was vice chairbusiness members from 1998-2000, coinciding with her term as BMBG chair, and vice chair-business member-at-large from 2000-2002.
