SCHOLARSHIPS FOR TRANSIT STUDENTS

Each year the APTF awards a minimum of twenty scholarships, ranging from \$2,500 to \$10,000, to college students and transit professionals who are pursuing or advancing their career in public transportation. Awards cover the academic year, beginning in the fall semester, and assist with tuition costs and other educational expenses.

Who Should Apply?

Applicants must be enrolled in a fully accredited institution, have and maintain at least a 3.0 GPA, and demonstrate a strong interest in entering the public transportation industry. College sophomores (30 hours or more satisfactorily completed), juniors, seniors, or those seeking advanced degrees may apply.

All applicants must be sponsored by an APTA member organization.

NJ STMC Tour for WTS members!

On Tuesday April 30, 2019, the NJ Programs Committee organized a technical tour of the Statewide Traffic Management Center located in Woodbridge, NJ for WTS members. Special guests at the tour included Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Transportation Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti, New Jersey Turnpike Authority (NJTA) Executive Director John Keller, NJTA Director of Operations Kevin Dunn, NJTA Deputy Director of Operations Frank Jordan, and the Manager of the Traffic Management Center Ruth Rodriguez. WTS volunteers at the event included Janet Sharkey (NJ Programs Committee Chair), Zenobia Fields (Vice President-NJ), and Kruti Barut (NJ Programs Committee member).

The event kicked off with welcome remarks given by the Commissioner who gave a brief history of the Traffic Management Center (TMC), calling it the heartbeat of incident management. Ruth Rodriguez, manager of the Traffic Management Center, then gave an overview and guided tour of the facility which is staffed by the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, New Jersey Department of Transportation, and the New Jersey State Police. Ms. Rodriguez showed the group the wide variety of video monitors, mapping, and software tools which help TMC staff quickly identify incidents, monitor them in real time, and provide a coordinated response to facilitate faster response and recovery times.
