Young Professionals Exploring Randalls Island by Bike

Much appreciation to the Young Professionals Committee for their hard work in organizing and hosting the second Annual Bike Tour in collaboration with NYC Department of Transportation Bicycle Program, Citi Bike, the NYC Parks Department, and the American Planning Association Transportation Committee.

This year's route, led by members of both Departments of Transportation and Parks staff, explored new and innovative infrastructure from East Harlem to and around Randall's Island Park. Despite threatening weather, the ride was a huge success. No rain, but much reward for the approximately 30-member group who rode over the Ward's Island Bridge to Randall's Island for a fun and very informative excursion. Along the way, we learned about the history of the island and how it used to be two smaller and separate islands, Randall's Island and Ward's Islands, both of which had been used for unpleasant social purposes in the 19th Century (potter's fields, asylums, and hospitals).

NYC DOT Strategic Initiatives Manager Alice Friedman focused on DOT's attention to Bronx-Manhattan bicycle and pedestrian access across the Harlem River as we biked around the island. A recent report, *Connecting Communities: A Vision for the Harlem River Bridges*, reflects the department's continuing efforts to provide the same opportunities that they successfully created in the late 1990's and early 2000's between Brooklyn and Manhattan, which ultimately has increased bike travel sevenfold.

Learn from a Leader: Madeleine Ehrlich McDonnell

2018 has been another successful year for Learn from a Leader. The speaker series featured three notable women in the field, Connie Crawford, Senior Vice President at Louis Berger; Griselda Cespedes, Capital Program Management and Chief Compliance Officer at MTA, and culminated with NYC DOT Director of Special Projects Madeleine Ehrlich McDonnell.

Ms. McDonnell's theme was the importance of "yes, and..," a game frequently played in improvisational theater to build positively on other people's ideas and to cooperate with them.

She talked about her own career and how capitalizing on the experience and education provided by people to whom she has reported and with whom she has worked has led her on a sometimes unexpected, sometimes slightly scary, but always rewarding professional path. A graduate of Cornell University's College of Arts and Sciences, Ms. McDonnell spent a few years at the Roosevelt Institute, a public policy think tank, where she worked in the Department of External Affairs and Development



before continuing her education at NYU's Wagner School for Public Service where she received a master's degree in public administration and management.

After finishing school, she was interested in gaining a "bird's eye view of a city agency" where she found a position as deputy chief of staff at NYC DOT. She credits her boss, Chief of Staff Emily Gallo and Commissioner Polly Trottenberg with their dedication to providing new and challenging opportunities for staff that allow them to flourish and grow professionally. Indeed, after she had been in her position for a few years, they directed her to assume a new role as acting director of special projects in the Bridges Division, a position that at first terrified her, but which ultimately offered her the opportunity for greater self-confidence and ability to assume a broader scope of work. After almost a year, she returned to a more familiar role as Director of Special Projects in the Office of the Chief Operating Officer. Along the way, she remarked that she is reminded of Tina Fey's well-known quote that "there are no mistakes, only opportunities."
