


Summary of Events



Transportation Equity Virtual Program

This year's summer program was in collaboration with COMTO Central Florida. The discussion was shaped around Transportation Equity. The program's moderator, Virginia Whittington (Metroplan Orlando), kicked off the conversation with a simple question to engage the audience.... *What definition of transportation equity from the 2021 MetroPlan survey most resonates with you?* Interestingly our audience gave us a vast range of answers; accessible and affordable transportation for everyone had the most votes.



Our panelists, shown below, all provided thought-provoking commentary throughout the program.

Virginia began with some startling statistics from the MetroPlan survey. Virginia also noted that, "the

average metropolitan Orlando resident can access more than half a million jobs by car within 30 minutes from their home while transit riders only have access to about 5,600 jobs in that same travel time." In addition, because they didn't have access to reliable transportation, 18% of respondents missed or skipped medical appointments this past year. This set the stage for the conversation.

Key points from the conversation included: Tanya's goal of connecting communities while shifting our thinking from car-centric to people-centric; Diana's encouragement to have the difficult conversations - if we are worried about saying the wrong thing, we will miss getting the right information and the right people at the table; Virginia reminded us to not only identify a problem but come with a solution; and Ann's takeaways were to be imaginative and to become the

solution, once we acknowledged that we were the problem.

The passion from our panelists and moderator transcended to the audience and left all in attendance knowing that yes, we all are the problem, but we are enthused to be a part of the solution.





Read to Succeed In 2020 prompted the WTSCFL Book Club, and we have already read two fantastic books this year and we had the added bonus of the authors joining us for the discussion.

On May 24th, Yvonne Lopez-Diaz introduced her friend Steve Farber and shared how they met and became friends after she read Greater Than Yourself a few years ago. Steve shared that this philosophy, termed GTY, talked about the combination of fictional journey and real

experiences woven into this book. The core message - you grow when you help others grow - resonated with the participants who had several questions to find their own GTY project. Steve talked about his free, daily audio message - sign up at stevefarber.com.

Angie Schmitt joined the WTSCFL Book Club on July 15th for a discussion about her book Right of Way. A woman who lives her beliefs, she joined from a Greyhound bus while taking her son to see his grandparents! Angie shared her thoughts on the book and responded to questions. The book was written prior to the pandemic. 2020 will have different numbers due to less car travel and more bicycle/pedestrian activity - but unfortunately that has not resulted in less pedestrian deaths. Looking back over the decade, the 50% increase in pedestrian fatalities from just before the pandemic is staggering. Victim blaming by the legal system and media is one area of concern. Dr. Laine Powell received WTS International Award

Dr. Laine Powell is the founder and executive director of **Tech Sassy Girlz**, a non-profit organization dedicated to inspiring underrepresented girls in middle and high school to engage in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Affectionately referred to as Dr. Sassy - Laine received the WTS International Rosa Parks Diversity Leadership award as part of the Virtual Conference in May.

Laine created Tech Sassy Girlz

in 2012 to address the critical shortage of women and minorities being represented in high-tech STEM careers. Prior to 2020, over 1,000 young women benefited from the program and in 2020, during the pandemic, over 1,500 were assisted as the remote learning enabled more students to get involved. In 2020 Laine also expanded to **STEM Iconz** for underreprested young men. She was recognized as one of Orlando Magazine's 2020 Women of the Year, by the NBA's Orlando Magic for community service, and received the i4Business Magazine Spirit of Collaboration Award, among many other recognitions!

In the community, she serves on the boards of WTS Central Florida Chapter, the Florida Polytechnic University, NAF Information Technology Academy, and the Women's Business Center at Seminole State College.

One of the programs in **Tech Sassy Girlz** is Pearls in Tech, which is a workforce development program for high school students for STEM internship opportunities. The program focuses in software development and web design with a certification exam allowing eligibility for paid internships and setting the foundations for careers in STEM.

WTSCFL members have participated in the Tech Sassy Girlz annual day conference. This program has grown from 40 attendees in 2012 to over 500 at the event held at the University of Central Florida in 2019.

Laine accepted the Rosa Parks Diversity Leadership award as part of the WTS International Virtual Conference based out of Richmond Virginia. In her recorded remarks, she had a fantastic analogy -- "Diversity is being invited to the party and inclusion is being asked to dance!"

On April 29th WTSCFL hosted A Walk In Her Shoes. This event is to hear from women leaders in transportation about their careers and advice. The plan was for Alison Stettner, AICP, Director of the Office of Policy Planning for the Florida Department of Transportation be a part of our outstanding panelists together with Betsy VanderLey, Former Orange County Commissioner, Senior Director of Business Development, and Dr. Lily Elefteriadou, the Barbara Goldsby Professor and Director of Civil Engineering at the University of Florida Transportation Institute with the esteemed moderator Carla Bell Johnson, Assistant County Administrator for Orange County. But, even after a year of practice doing virtual meetings, we had a snafu with Alison's connection, so Carla focused on Betsy and Lily as well as shared some of her own career stories. The life experiences that shaped and elevated their careers and family lives were inspiring.

Like preceding years, WTSCFL partnered with Dress for Success of Central Florida to support their mission of empowering women in our community to thrive and achieve economic independence.


