WTS San Diego Legislation and Infrastructure Funding Breakfast Program June 22, 2022

The WTS San Diego Legislation and Infrastructure Funding Breakfast Program was held on June 22, 2022. Patti Boekamp, the Senior Director and Local Business Leader of WSP, moderated the event. The distinguished panel featured Avital Barnea, the Deputy Secretary for Transportation Planning at the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA), Charlene Lee Lorenzo, Director of the FTA Region IX Los Angeles Office which covers 10 counties in Southern California, and Robyn Wapner, the Senior Director of the Department of Public Affairs at SANDAG.

The program featured information regarding how legislation affects our industry in the eyes of local, state, and federal perspectives. The panel of speakers also discussed what the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) will bring to the industry. The program detailed the IIJA and included a breakdown of the funding and differences that this bill contains compared to others. The program included questions and answers that addressed how California will benefit from this bill and other details about how local agencies can prepare for, and support, the regional effort.

The attendees were provided with a great detail of information on where the funds from the bill will be allocated with an emphasis on projects related to highway and public transportation infrastructure and other spending that will support projects such as broadband, water infrastructure, ports, and airports. The panelist also spoke about how this large influx of funding will create new infrastructure jobs in California and their efforts in recruiting and retaining individuals to add to the infrastructure workforce. They expressed how building out this workforce is one of the most important aspects as it relates to the IIJA bill and California's future and how demand for training in skilled trades will likely grow as infrastructure workforce needs grow. They touched on how they are working to develop strategies that focus on local hiring ordnances and creating action plans as it relates to training and workforce development.

Centered around the six domains of self-care, Dr. Gobin provides a simple guide to help her readers create an achievable action plan to find purpose and harmony between life, family, and work. In this book, you will better understand the concept of self-care and develop strategies to better organize your life, resist demotivation, and help you grow in the areas you feel are lacking.

Would I recommend this book?

Yes. I was very impressed with the book's organization, with each chapter dedicated to one of the six self-care domains: physical, spiritual, emotional, intellectual, social, and vocational. Each chapter's topic goes straight to the point, with easy-to-understand examples and activities. I recommend this book to anyone who may feel overwhelmed from time to time, lacking in any area of their life, or would like to consider a different perspective to achieve selfcare.

This book is available in paperback, Kindle, and Audible.

The WTS Transportation YOU program is a hands-on interactive program that offers young girls an introduction to various transportation careers. I didn't get introduced to the concept of transportation as a career path until college, and it was purely by accident. The TYOU program is the program I wish I knew about when I was in middle or high school.

Early in 2022, WTSI announced the TYOU program is going through a revamping stage. Our San Diego chapter decided to take this as an opportunity to make the program everything we knew it could be.




