



In 2021, the Finance Committee reviewed the overall financial health of WTS-Boston - including the yearly revenue and expenditures, investments, and scholarship account.




Communications Committee

Diversity Committee

The Diversity Committee serves as an internal resource and guide for WTS-Boston Committees to use in a collective commitment to increase diversity, inclusion, equity, access, and representation within the organization, industry, and communities we serve.



The Diversity Committee organized and hosted/co-hosted the following events:

DEI in Transportation—COMTO and WTS Dialogue

In a joint event with COMTO Boston, COMTO Interim President & CEO, Tara McDaniel, and WTS International Executive Director, Sara Stickler, discussed their organizations' shared goal of advancing diversity, equity and inclusion in transportation.

Diversity Speaker Fund Event: Equity and Justice in Transportation with Tamika L. Butler

Using the Speaker Fund, which was established in 2020, the committee invited Tamika L. Butler, a national expert and speaker on issues related to the built environment, equity, anti-racism, diversity and inclusion, organizational behavior, and change management, to speak on how we as transportation professionals can employ genuine equity efforts in our daily work to ensure our projects better serve all communities. This interactive event allowed for the committee to receive feedback from attendees on how WTS-Boston can be a more inclusive, accessible organization.

WTS Boston Outreach-Diversity Joint Event: Women on the Move: Mobility for Women, Mobility for All

In a joint event with WTS-Boston's Outreach Committee and APAP-MA's Transportation Committee, a panel of experts on sustainability, mobility, and gender explored how design of transportation systems, networks, and technologies could better reflect the needs of all users.

Professional Development-Diversity Joint Event: Unconscious Bias: 50 Ways to Fight Back Following the Lean In model of "50 ways to Fight Bias"

The event provided the attendees practical tools to fight back workspace biases through sharing real-life examples, peer discussions, and accountability.

In Addition, in 2021, the diversity committee has started and consistently communicated **Diversity-in-Motion monthly E-blasts** to provide backgrounds, contexts, information regarding diversity, equity, and inclusion topics.

Furthermore, the committee has expanded upon its previously developed **gender inclusivity statement** to support inclusivity throughout WTS-Boston events and communications. WTS-Boston is a gender inclusive organization, it embraces and welcomes all women, men, and gender non-conforming individuals. The organization, however, has yet to acknowledge this with any member/public-facing content. The Committee proposes that the WTS-Boston chapter should outwardly express its values of inclusion and diversity through the gender inclusivity statement. Such a statement would be particularly helpful for gender non-confirming individuals who may be unsure about whether they will be welcomed and respected by the Chapter.

Fundraising Committee

The WTS-Boston Fundraising Committee raises funds through its Annual Sponsorship Program



to support scholarships and the operations of the Chapter. The 2021 Fundraising Committee was led by co-chairs Grace Lin of Stantec and Sasha Vinton of RND Consultants.

The Fundraising Committee has built a long-term, sustainable program that is recognized throughout WTS International as a model for local chapter fundraising. Three levels of sponsorship allow for participation regardless of the size of the firm. Sponsor benefits range from corporate logos on the WTS-Boston webpage to tickets to specific annual events, depending upon sponsorship level. Sponsors can attend the New Year's Reception and the invitation-only Annual Leadership Breakfast in April free of charge.

As we faced restrictions due to COVID-19 in 2021, WTS-Boston continued to fully operate the organization. Our Chapter fully realized that postponing events early on during the pandemic resulted in our sponsors not having access to many benefits that the annual sponsorship normally provides. As a result, our Board of Directors voted unanimously to extend our 2020 sponsorships through 2021 at no additional cost to make up for the loss experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Meanwhile, our chapter encouraged sponsors continued support of the WTS-Boston Scholarship Fund by making donations based on the sponsor level from 2020:

- Executive Sponsors \$500
- Associate Sponsors \$250
- Supporter Sponsors \$150

The **2021 Sponsors** included 27 at the Executive level, 9 at the Associate level and 9 at the Supporter level. Beta Group, Inc upgraded to be our Associate level sponsor. Kimley-Horn became our Chapter's new Associate level sponsor. In 2021, we have raised a total of \$15,050 of which \$13,600 was given to the WTS Boston Scholarship Fund.

The Fundraising Committee has created and updated a sponsor longevity tracking database populated with records going back over a decade. While some companies have been acquired and the industry has experienced periods of recession and growth during that time, the Boston chapter of WTS has continued to experience strong support from sponsor firms. The Fundraising Committee coordinates with several other WTS-Boston committees including

Communications, Special Projects, and Programs to ensure that the chapter supporters receive their valuable benefits.

Mentoring Committee

In 2021, the WTS-Boston Mentoring Committee developed programming that supported mentoring at all career levels through Formal Mentoring, TED Talks, Management Networking Roundtable, and Emerging Professional programs.

Formal Mentoring Program

We successfully administered the Formal Mentoring Program from March to June 2021. Involvement included both one-on-one time with mentor-mentee pairs and group professional development events open to all program participants. Like the previous year, the committee matched the mentor-mentee pairs after the kickoff speed networking event in March 2021. We held the entire program in a fully virtual format, given the pandemic.

The program's overall objective is to provide the opportunity for rising professionals to access more experienced professionals in the industry, allowing them to gain insights that could have a lasting and tangible effect on their careers. Mentors also benefit by helping to cultivate the growth of a future leader in transportation, learning together with their mentee, building long-term relationships, and giving back to an industry that has supported them in their careers.

Despite the circumstances presented by COVID-19, the participants remained engaged, and the program received positive feedback. The 2022 call for applications occurred during December and January and we have eleven pairs participating in this year's extended sixmonth program.

2021 Emerging Professionals

During the last year, COVID-19- has impacted our lives one way or another, through friends, families, work, travel... just to name a few. Just like in most things, it also had an impact on our WTS Emerging Professional program, but for the good. Due to the pandemic, our EPs were able to stay with us for another year and continue to tap into all the opportunities offered by the EP Program, which aims to assist in the development of our future leaders. Francisca Fleming and Dieckmann Cogill were the EP liaisons for 2021.

In 2020, WTS-Boston selected two Emerging Professionals for the program: Ambar Johnson and Katie Kalugin. Both talented women decided to stay with us another year and joined the 3 new EPs for 2021. The new EPs selected for 2021 were Fangyun Xi, MassDOT Highway

Transportation Program Planner; Ruth Nan, MBTA Signal Engineer; and Leah Grodstein, MassDOT Civil Engineer. Each EP chose a WTS Boston Committee to actively participate in, and they reported their activities to the group and to the liaisons monthly. We had active participation in the Mentoring, Outreach, Diversity, Special Projects, and the Student Chapter Committees. Each EP also was assigned an Advisor from the WTS Board or other WTS leaders. Advisors and EPs met to set goals for the EP program and to help EPs navigate the WTS structure. One success was that we had an EP selected for the WTS Board of Directors. Special thank you to the Advisors for their time and dedication, Francisca Fleming, Anna Barry, Margo English, Allison Sweeney, and Laurie Carlson. Through the process of connecting to advisors, the EPs were able to organize an onsite tour of the Green Line Extension project. EPs attended several virtual WTS Events and WTS Board meetings. They also published an article about their EP experience. As of 2021, we have also begun to maintain a database of past EPs. In November of 2021 we began the process of recruiting the EP class of 2022. This process resulted in 5 applications, and we are currently in the process of scoring and selecting the candidates.

Management Networking Roundtable

In 2021 the Management Networking Roundtable was held, virtually, in May. The topics discussed were "Elevating your Business Acumen" and "Navigating Difficult business relationships.

The "Fall" roundtable event had some scheduling challenges with other WTS events and was scheduled for December but was rescheduled to January 2022. The topic will be "Stop Networking and Start Making Connections".

TED Talk

The WTS-Boston Mentoring Committee held a virtual TED Talk event titled "Workplace Mental Health- all you need to know (for now)" on July 21, 2021. This event was moderated by Lorraine McAteer from Mott MacDonald. The TED Talk was selected as many are challenged with maintaining a work/life balance, which can sometimes lead to anxiety and depression. This TED Talk discussed the challenges surrounding wellness in the workplace and ways we can be proactive before one reaches their breaking point. It led to discussions around focusing on boosting our wellness and mental health.

Professional Development Committee

The Professional Development Committee leveraged the virtual environment to host a variety of well-attended events in 2021. Covering both soft skills and technical topics, both public and private sector presenters, we had a productive and successful year.

January 12, 2021 - Digital Butts in Seats: Creating Online Events that Don't Suck

Kicking off the year, the Professional Development Committee hosted Paige Malott of CascadiaRail, who had a lively presentation with various suggestions backed by research for how to keep an online audience engaged in your presentation.

February 26, 2021 - How to Host a WTS Zoom Event

Ali Love, Theresa Carr, and Lindsey Vasquez presented How to Host a WTS Zoom Event on February 26 to demonstrate to the Board and Committee leadership how to use the various tools and functions available in our Zoom account. Included with this presentation the team pulled together resources to include in the Protocol Book and set up a folder for WTS users to reference all the tips and techniques available.

March 11, 2021 - The Confidence Code Book Club

A group of 14 women attended a lively discussion centered on the main themes of the Confidence Code book. The event started with a discussion on how each attendee felt about their own confidence and continued with offering support, tips/tricks, etc. to other attendees. The group also discussed resources for improving confidence levels. The group requested a way to stay in touch following the event, so an email thread was set up to share contact information. The event was facilitated by Sarah Dennechuk and Kristine Gorman.

May 4, 2021 - Mastering the Art of Negotiation

Event hosted by Carla Moynihan of Sherin and Lodgen. The presentation covered the basics of negotiation, some tips and tricks, and what you should know before you negotiate. The second part of the event featured two role playing exercises which showed example negotiations between a consultant and a client and an employer and employee. Following the role-playing exercises there were two breakout sessions to discuss each scenario. These sessions led to great discussions about how to successfully negotiate.

June 3, 2021 - I Received a Project Schedule - Now What?

Event led by John Audi, PhD., CCM of BSC Group. John shared his extensive knowledge of how to develop, maintain, and maximize the benefits of a project schedule. The session included discussion of the advantages of crafting an accurate project schedule and an outline of the components and basic steps towards building, updating, and reading the schedule. The conversation also focused on the importance of understanding concepts such as critical path and work breakdown structure, and expert guidance on best practices and common errors to avoid.

July 15, 2021 - Unconscious Bias: 50 Ways to Fight Back

The Diversity Committee and Professional Development Committee co-hosted a session entitled Unconscious Bias: 50 Ways to Fight Back moderated by Lydia Grose, VP and Philadelphia Office Executive at Michael Baker International and President of COMTO Philadelphia. August 17, 2021 - MassDOT Design Justification Workbook Training

Event led by key MassDOT staff: Andy Paul (MassDOT State Highway Design Engineer), Jackie DeWolfe (MassDOT Director of Sustainable Mobility) and Andrew Wilkins (MassDOT Transit Coordinator). MassDOT's mission is to deliver excellent customer service to people traveling in the Commonwealth by providing transportation infrastructure, which is safe, reliable, robust, and resilient. MassDOT, in alignment with this mission, works to provide a transportation system that can strengthen the state's economy and improve the quality of life for all.

November 16, 2021 - Public Speaking Tips and Tricks

Event hosted by Margaret O'Meara. Margaret's virtual presentation on public speaking first focused on answering the question of why public speaking is important. Next, she described several key facets aimed at equipping listeners with tools for improving confidence and honing their abilities. The Programs Committee hosted four virtual luncheon seminars and an in-person tour over the summer. A summary of our 2021 events and programs is provided below.

February 11, 2021 - MassDOT Aeronautics Division Administrator, Dr. Jeffrey DeCarlo

WTS-Boston hosted Dr. Jeffrey DeCarlo, MassDOT's Aeronautics Division Administrator who is responsible for providing statutory and regulatory oversight for all aviation matters in Massachusetts, including safety, security, airport development, and UAS programs. He leads the Commonwealth UAS Integration Program, an industry, academia, and government collaborative focused on enabling UAS and Counter-UAS systems. Dr. DeCarlo has more than 30-years of aviation operations and consulting experience with the military, industry, academia and government. An experienced principal investigator, he led NASA sponsored air traffic control and airport operations R & D; and has supported aviation systems acquisition activities for the DOD.

March 25, 2021 - Panel of Massachusetts Regional Transit Authority Female Leaders

To celebrate Women's History Month, WTS-Boston hosted a panel discussion featuring female leaders of Massachusetts' Regional Transit Authorities. Moderated by Meredith Slesinger (MassDOT Deputy Rail and Transit Administrator), the panel consisted of Angie Gompert (Administrator of the Martha's Vineyard Transit Authority), Sandra Sheehan (Administrator of the Pioneer Valley Transit Authority), and Felicia Webb (Administrator of the Cape Ann Transportation Authority (CATA)). The following is a brief summary of each of the esteemed women:

August 26, 2021 - Summer Tour - MBTA's GLX Project

WTS-Boston members and non-members took part in a private tour of Massachusetts Bay Transit Authority's (MBTA) Green Line Extension (GLX) Project! The tour was led by MBTA GLX Program Manager of Stakeholder Engagement, Terry McCarthy, and City Point Partner's Marty Nee. Tour participants attended a safety briefing prior to embarking on the tour route. The tour was followed by a networking event at the Tavern at the End of the World.

September 22, 2021 – Sec. of Transportation / CEO of MassDOT, Jamey Tesler

WTS-Boston hosted Jamey Tesler, MassDOT Secretary of Transportation and CEO. Prior to his current role, Mr. Tesler served as the Registrar of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV). He led the agency through a significant organizational overhaul, reprioritizing and bolstering the RMV's public-safety related responsibilities. Mr. Tesler also drastically improved the RMV's business model to continue providing quality service options to customers during the COVID-19 pandemic. He instituted an appointment-only system and enhanced online transaction capabilities, including an online learner's permit test.

December 16, 2021 – Acting Deputy Administrator/Chief Engineer at MassDOT, Carrie Lavallee

WTS-Boston hosted Carrie Lavallee, Acting Deputy Administrator/Chief Engineer of MassDOT. On the heels of the highly anticipated infrastructure bill, she focused her discussion on leading the way to better infrastructure in Massachusetts.

Ms. Lavallee has nearly two decades of experience working in multiple roles at MassDOT. Most recently, she served as the District 6 Project Development Engineer, helping to develop solutions to some of the most complex transportation problems facing the Greater Boston area. She is an active member of WTS-Boston, a certified bridge inspector, licensed professional engineer, and holds a BS in Civil Engineering from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst.

This year, the Student Chapter Committee also gained four new volunteers to assist the Committee in its pursuits. The multiple events hosted by the Student Chapter this year wholly embodied the mission of WTS International – working to build the future of transportation through the global advancement of women.

In February 2021, the Chapter hosted a virtual Roundtable event on Zoom centered on advice for young professionals and students on navigating post-grad life. The event featured three UMass Alumnae panelists from three various aspects of the transportation industry with different levels of experience, who discussed their career paths and answered questions on the paths that can be taken after graduation.

Transportation YOU

The co-chairs for the 2021 Transportation YOU committee were Katherine Patch, Fuss & O'Neill and Emily Buck, McMahon Associates. Ali Love, STV, acted as Board Liaison to the committee.

The committee decided early in the year to hold events virtually, in compliance with CDC restrictions around the COVID-19 pandemic. The committee was able to participate



in the Cambridge Science Festival (entire month of April), WPI Touch Tomorrow (June 6th-12th), and Massachusetts STEM week (October 18th-22nd), along with other virtual activities throughout the year.

Cambridge Science Festival

The committee's first event of the year was for the Cambridge Science Festival and included a virtual bridge tour held on April 19th. For this event, committee volunteers paired up and stationed themselves at bridges throughout Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Multiple bridge types were represented, including cable stay, arch, and suspension. Each bridge type/location started off with



a demonstration video in which committee volunteers explained how the type of bridge works structurally. The video then moved to a real-world example where the stationed committee volunteers shared the history, fun facts, and structural makeup of each bridge to participants who were viewing the live event from home.

WPI Touch Tomorrow

A recording of the Bridge Tour was then edited for WPI Touch Tomorrow, which was posted on the events website as one of the many guided hands-on activities submitted as part of the event. In addition to watching the virtual tour, committee members put together a lesson plan for each bridge type to allow students to complete a hands-on activity from home.

BoSTEM

The committee connected with BoSTEM through United Way early in the year (March), creating an exciting new contact in the Boston STEM community. The committee was able to work with them for a virtual panel hosted during Massachusetts STEM week.

Career Panel for the Town of Everett

In addition to connecting with new STEM contacts, the committee was able to work with past contacts, participating in a career panel for the Town of Everett on May 10th. For this panel, three committee volunteers shared their career experiences and paths to students at Everett Public Schools.

Transportation YOU Boston Summit

The committee ended the year with the fourth annual Transportation YOU Boston Summit which was held virtually on October 16th as part of Mass STEM week. Planning for the event began earlier in the spring with a call for workshop volunteers. Based on experiences from the 2020 virtual Summit, the committee



focused on organizing activities for each workshop that would include hands-on activities, using materials that would be mailed to participants prior to the event.



The Summit ran from 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM, kicking off the day with Transportation Bingo hosted by Heather Moulton, STV and Christine McLaughlin, HNTB. An opening address was then given by Monica Tibbits-Nutt, 128 Business Council. The workshops were hosted by five groups of volunteers from 128 Business Council, BSC Group, GZA, Stantec, STV, VHB & AECOM. Each workshop included groups of 10-15 students who rotated to each hands-on activity to follow along and complete from home. Giveaways from each sponsoring firm were also included in the material packets that were distributed to each student. The event included informational videos provided by WTS-Boston Member Christie Baker, AECOM, Martha Jimenez, HNTB, Kim Degutis GZA, and multiple participants from BSC Group.

WTS International, Northeast Region Council

"WTS International chapters are the association's most important local delivery channel. By developing and organizing into regions, the bandwidth of WTS chapters is expanded."

There are six (6) region councils that include one representative from each chapter in the region. WTS-Boston is part of the Northeast Region, with the Boston representative, Loretta Girard Doughty, New Hampshire Department of Transportation, serving her second year of a two-year term as Chair in 2021-2022. As Chair, Loretta also serves on the WTS International Advisory Board.

An important aspect of the Region Council is to aid in the formation of new chapters. The Northeast Region is the largest Region Council with sixteen (16) chapters; two (2) of which were ratified in 2021: WTS-Delaware and WTS-West Virginia. In addition, there is one (1) chapter currently in formation: WTS-SW Ontario. Loretta also served as a Founding Member of the WTS-New Hampshire Chapter, which was ratified in 2020.

The Northeast Region Council also submitted their 2022 Workplan to WTS International in November 2021; the 2022 events planned include Northeast Region President's calls (quarterly), New/Small Chapter Roundtable (first quarter), Northeast Region Treasurer's calls (bi-annually), and a Northeast Region Event (fourth quarter).
