ince its inception six years ago, Transit Equity Day has become a national day of advocacy, activities, and action for supporters of public transportation. This year on February 4th, Georgia cities, transit authorities, and transit advocacy groups addressed public transportation equity and encouraged increased ridership to recognize Transit Equity Day and honor Rosa Parks, a key figure in the Civil Rights movement who was arrested for refusing to give up her seat on a segregated public transit bus. Parks' birthday is on February 4th.

Transit Equity Day was started in 2018 by the Amalgamated Transit Union (ATU) and the Labor Network for Sustainability to honor Parks' legacy by calling for a national day of action to promote transit as a workers' rights, civil rights, and climate-justice issue on her birthday every year. The event has grown significantly, gaining and sustaining a national presence since 2020. Here are just a few of the Transit Equity Day events that occurred in Georgia this year:

 The Atlanta Transit Coalition, a group of transit, environmental, and equity advocacy organizations, and Propel ATL issued a challenge in honor of Transit Equity Day. The Coalition encouraged people to ride the bus, talk about transit equity on social media and attend a MARTA meeting to show support for "frequent and reliable" transit. The group also called

- upon elected officials to replace their cars with public transit for the day to better understand the intricacies of navigating the bus and rail lines in Metro Atlanta. The group gathered at Five Points Station on February 4th to advocate for accessible and affordable transportation.

 Greenwood also participated in a community event with civil rights leaders, clergy, labor leaders and transit supporters at West End Station to discuss accessible, reliable, and equitable transit. - Chatham Area Transit Authority dedicated a seat to Parks on all of its fixed route buses, posting information about Parks' role in the Civil Rights movement.
- Sustainable CSRA, an environmental conservation organization, hosted a community program in Augusta to bring attention to the City's transit system and invite attendees to take a bus ride in Parks' honor.


