## FEBRUARY LUNCHEON

Advancing women Advancing transportation > Heart of Texas



#### Creating Equitable and Accessible **Transportation Systems**

More than 150 people attended the February luncheon program, with the WTS Heart of Texas Chapter partnering with the Austin Chapter of the Conference of Minority Transportation Officials (COMTO), to host the event. COMTO is a leading national advocate for employment diversity, inclusion, and contracting opportunities in the multi-modal, multi-billion-dollar transportation industry.

The event's theme spoke to the interests of both partners, Creating Equitable and Accessible Transportation Systems. Moderated by Tracy Thompson, Chief Administrative and External Affairs Officer with Austin Bergstrom International Airport, panelists included Courtney Chavez, Director of Equity and Inclusion with Austin Transit Partnership (ATP), and Martin Kareithi, Director of Systemwide Accessibility with Capital Metro.

The panel kicked off the meeting by defining the terms "equity" and "accessibility" to make sure everyone was on the same page. Courtney talked about building ATP's equity program from the ground up, and how her team weaves that important value into everyday operations.

As a blind man navigating the public transit system, Martin reflected on how far physical accessibly standards have come on Capital Metro's system. He shared personal anecdotes from his own experiences, as well as those of a former colleague, that demonstrate the significant accessibility achievements made in the last decade.

Courtney shared her thoughts on ATP's commitment to equity and accessibility, and how the young agency is balancing the need to move quickly to develop projects while also approaching system design with a methodical and comprehensive incorporation of design standards for equity and access.

The panel closed out the discussion with a call to action for all those in attendance, noting that the best solutions for equity and access will result from continued collaboration by both transportation agencies and their consulting partners as work continues to build out Austin's infrastructure system.



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#### Future of the Transportation Industry Workforce

In honor of International Women's Day, our March luncheon focused on recruiting young women to the transportation field. The panel of speakers included Dr. Yunlan (Emma) Zhang and Dr. Alexandra Clarà Saracho, both professors at the University of Texas at Austin, as well as Sheila Brooks, a recruiter with TxDOT.

The panel discussion was focused on the future of women leaders, along with the skills and attributes needed to succeed in transportation positions. The moderator, WTS Programs Chair Laurie Simmons, asked questions about the general decline in Civil Engineering graduates and why it is harder to recruit students into the transportation field. Reasons include:

- Civil Engineers are paid less than other types of engineers.
- Civil Engineering grads are being recruited to other higher paying industries like tech, aerospace, and biomedical.
- Students want to see their values reflected in the work they do.

Both Dr. Zhang and Dr. Clarà Saracho also provided insights between women and men in both academia and the workforce. For example, females are generally less confident than male students, they need more positive feedback on an ongoing basis, and they are motivated differently. Across genders, Gen Z students are very tech driven and embrace new ways of working. The panelists offered ways to draw more students into the civil engineering field, specifically in transportation:

- Offer hybrid work options and flexibility.
- Foster a close-knit family culture in the workplace.
- Provide mentorship opportunities and formal training programs.

• Show more representation of females in manager positions.

Brooks also talked about reaching out to students at a much younger age to endorse the profession, and talked about different K-12 programs TxDOT is working on bringing to local schools around the state. In order to get more younger people to move into the profession, education on the possibilities of civil engineering and transportation career paths needs to start at an early age. As an industry, the panelists all agreed that there should be a focus on the bigger picture issues and how transportation jobs can help drive change and create improvements in quality of life for future generations.



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### LYNN ISAAK, MENTORSHIP CHAIR

In 2019 I was fortunate to have volunteered to mentor an Ann Richards School for Young Woman Leaders student through the Transportation YOU Mentorship Program with the WTS HOT chapter. It had been a while since I mentored a student because of the strong bond I had built with my foreign exchange student over the 10 months she lived with our family the year prior. But I was ready to return to positively affecting the life of a young girl interested in the STEM field.

Under the leadership of Mary Jo Galindo, the Transportation YOU program was an excellent way for me to get involved and meet a student who would be interested in having a mentor throughout the school year. Mary Jo and I went to Mr. Smith's Engineering Lab to speak with the students and encourage them to apply to be matched with a mentor. As luck would have it, Alexa Minchaca was responding to the opportunity. Alexa and I were matched and



quickly learned about each other throughout the year. I was impressed with Alexa's project that she and another student constructed; a melody-playing hand sanitizing dispenser. Alexa learned all about my career path, education, and current position. I learned about Alexa's family, dreams, aspirations, and goals. It was incredible to meet such a young person who knew what she wanted to do and whom she wanted to become. We became fast friends, and as the year progressed, we realized we would continue our relationship into the summer and beyond.

Alexa and I were selected to be part of the Washington DC experience where Transportation YOU matches from around the U.S. came together to tour transportation-related attractions, learn about all the many ways that you are affected by transportation, and explore the many careers that one can take in the transportation industry. Our experience in DC made it evident that we wanted to be paired together the next school year! So, we resumed in the fall of 2019 just like we never left off. This school year was Alexa's senior year, and we worked through all the various college options for her and scholarship opportunities. Alexa became a household name (much to the chagrin of my Amazon Alexa at home).

As Alexa started to think about college, the pandemic hit, and we were forced to have our mentoring sessions via Facetime. It was a difficult time for everyone; however, Alexa was deeply impacted at home and school by the effects of the changing times. We may have shed a few tears together as it was trying times to navigate. As luck would have it, a past college coach helped Alexa with advice that I needed to be equipped to offer her. With Alexa's tenacity and perseverance, she was offered a full-ride scholarship to the University of Houston in Mechanical Engineering. I was floored and super proud!

Alexa may not know this, but with her applications underway, she motivated me to pursue a lifelong dream of returning to business school for my MBA. As she was applying, I was too, and we both started at our respective universities that fall.

Then as I understood that there were scholarships available to college students, I encouraged Alexa to apply for a WTS scholarship. And I did as well! As I sat on the virtual 2020 gala as a scholarship recipient, I realized that Alexa received a scholarship too. It's thrilling to be connected through Transportation YOU, and I highly encourage everyone to consider being a mentor, putting yourself out there to help others! You never know where it will lead and how it will turn out!



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### **ALEXA MINCHACA, MENTEE**

Where do I begin? Joining the WTS Transportation YOU Mentorship Program is one of the best decisions I've ever made. I applied for a WTS HOT chapter scholarship a week before winter break, not really thinking much about it, only that it's a cool opportunity. Once I got accepted I never expected to experience what I did. I like to think of my experience in the WTS Transportation YOU Mentorship Program in three parts. Meeting my mentor, the gala, and a trip to Washington DC for the Transportation YOU conference.



To begin, I was paired with Lynn Isaak. I was excited to meet her, and once we did we scheduled a regular time to meet up weekly. It was

always a good day when she came by my school and we would have lunch together. We would talk about her work and what she does. I would fill her in with any school projects I had at the time, which where many! But most importantly, we built a really strong bond with each other. She met my parents and we even invited her to my sister's quinceñera. My family and I appreciate her because she helped me navigate and learn a lot about the engineering field and applying to college, something my parents couldn't provide for me at her level.

The next big moment in this program was the gala. I never thought I would ever be part of an event like the gala which was just a big celebration for people who won awards. My dad and I got to dress up with the theme, attend the event, and enjoy ourselves. Being there with my mentor and being in that moment made me realize I had great potential. I just had to grow and work with the opportunities I was told about.

Lastly, one of my best experiences was the trip to the Transportation YOU conference in Washington DC. I was amazed that I was even offered the opportunity to go. I went with my mentor and it was amazing. We had the opportunity to meet other girls and mentors from across the country. We had good food and went into many federal buildings learning about transportation and the different aspects that go into it.

The WTS Mentorship program has been one of the best things I have ever done and has left one of the biggest impacts on my life. I will forever be grateful for my mentor and the opportunities I got to experience with her through this program.

# MEMBERS ONLY NETWORKING EVENT


