# EMERGING LEADERS PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SERIES

hether you are a recent graduate trying to map their way to financial health or a seasoned professional looking for tips on the best way to grow their wealth, Richard Slaton, CCIM provided advice for all during the April 20th WTS Atlanta Emerging Leaders Series. During this virtual event, titled "How to Grow Your Finances As You Grow Your Career," Slaton, Executive Director at JP Morgan Chase Commercial Bank, presented seven steps that he said serve as a roadmap to managing your finances. steps that he said serve as a roadmap to managing your finances.

"Follow these steps, in this order, and you will be successful," he said. Slaton has spent most of his career working with real estate and development and his current work focuses on providing financial solutions for affordable housing developers. Though Slaton did caution that immediate progress won't always be evident. "It's a marathon, not a sprint. It requires some discipline and a lot of work."

He encouraged the nearly 30 WTS Atlanta members who joined the event to regularly review the steps he highlighted and track their progress. While Slaton personally reviews his finances quarterly, he recommends reviewing them twice per year at a minimum. WTS Atlanta members attended the event and peppered Slaton with questions after the presentation, asking about selecting financial advisors, growing your income, and property investment. He offered actionable advice on all items and members were excited to reach out to him for further advice at the end of the session.

The WTS Emerging Leaders series is a series of professional development webinars designed to equip young professionals with the necessary tools and teach them skills that will help them thrive in their personal lives and professional careers. The webinars cover an array of topics including financial literacy, work-life balance, mental health and wellness, leadership, emotional intelligence, and many more. Though the webinars are aimed at young professionals, the information provided is intended to inform professionals at all career levels.

Prior to US Trust, he worked as a Real Estate Development Manager with The Integral Group, LLC where he focused on the development of affordable housing and mixed-use projects. During Mr. Slaton's career he also worked at Wachovia Bank as Real Estate Lender and Fulton County Government as a Real Estate Manager.

Mr. Slaton graduated from Morehouse College with a BA in Finance and minors in Real Estate and Accounting. He holds a MBA in Finance from Kennesaw State University. He is a Certified Commercial Investment Member (CCIM) and a licensed real estate broker in the state of Georgia. Mr. Slaton is on the business school faculty at Morehouse College where he lectures on topics related to Corporate Finance, Investment Finance and Real Estate Finance.
