

## Women's Transportation Seminar (WTS) Philadelphia Chapter Sylvia Alston Graduate Scholarship Application Carmen E. Turner Graduate Scholarship Application

WTS Philadelphia fosters the development of women in the transportation field by encouraging bright new professionals to undertake careers in the area of transportation. One way it does this is by awarding the Sylvia Alston Graduate Scholarship and the Carmen E. Turner Graduate Scholarship to women currently pursuing graduate degrees in a transportation-related field.

Sylvia Alston dedicated her life to transportation and supporting women in transportation. Sylvia spent over 20 years at Amtrak. She wore many hats while at Amtrak, but most remember her as the Officer of Supplier Diversity. She had an extraordinary commitment to WTS and recruited many WTS members that are still active in the Chapter. She received the WTS Philadelphia Member of the Year award in 1996 and was President of the Chapter from 1998 to 2000. She was instrumental in developing the Gateway Membership and the Milestone Award. Her quiet and determined demeanor made her an excellent leader of the Chapter and an inspiration to all who served with her. The Chapter honors her commitment to WTS by naming a graduate scholarship in her name.

Carmen E. Turner was the General Manager of the Washington (DC) Metropolitan Area Transportation Authority (WMATA). The first African American woman to head a major transit system, Ms. Turner held that post from 1983 through December of 1990. Her exceptional abilities were recognized in 1989 when the American Public Transit Association presented her with its Jesse-Haugh Award for Outstanding Transit Managers. Since Ms. Turner's untimely death in 1992, the Philadelphia Chapter of WTS has been proud to recognize an exceptional human being and attempt to continue her achievements and leadership by making our annual contribution to the future in her name.

The minimum criteria for selection are as follows:

- a) Minimum 3.0 GPA
- b) Currently enrolled in a graduate degree program in a transportation-related field, such as transportation engineering, planning, policy, finance, or logistics
- c) Plans to pursue a career in a transportation-related field

The scholarships are competitive and based on the applicant's specific transportation involvement, goals, job skills and academic record. WTS Philadelphia is committed to the inclusion of differences and similarities related to ethnicity, age, and gender identity. Local recipients will be announced in November 2023. The final decision for all scholarship awards is solely within the discretion of the WTS Philadelphia Scholarship Committee.

Local Philadelphia Chapter winners for each scholarship may advance for the opportunity to win the WTS International Foundation's national scholarship award. Winners of the WTS Philadelphia Chapter Sylvia Alston and Carmen E. Turner Graduate Scholarships may be entered at the International Level for one of the graduate level scholarships: the WTS International Helene M. Overly Graduate Scholarship and the WTS Leadership Legacy Scholarship.

All materials must be typed and submitted in electronic format (submission of a single .pdf is preferred). Except for the letter of recommendation, all materials must arrive in a single email with the subject line "WTS GR Scholarship - <insert your last name>. All materials must be received by 11:59pm EST on Friday, November 3, 2023. All submission materials and questions should be directed to:
