The Future of Environmental Reviews in Central Texas



Earlier this year, the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 passed Congress in order to avert hitting the debt limit, and combined into the bill were major changes to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). So what does this mean for future infrastructure projects undergoing environmental reviews here in Central Texas? Join us at our WTS Heart of Texas Chapter October luncheon to learn more about the Council on Environmental Quality's Phase II Rulemaking for amendments to NEPA and as well as other major initiatives going on at TxDOT from Director of Environmental Affairs, Doug Booher.

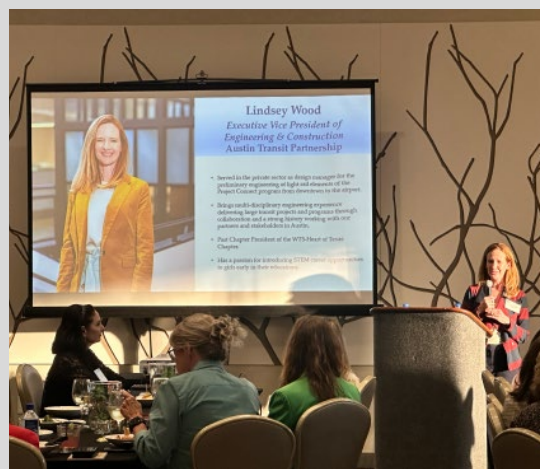
Booher joined TxDOT in March of 1991. Except for a three-year stint in the private sector, he has worked 25 years at multiple TxDOT offices, including the Austin District, the Texas Turnpike Authority Division, and the Environmental Affairs (ENV) Division, where he served as the deputy director.

In 2021, Doug Booher became the director of TxDOT's Environmental Affairs Division. The division oversees TxDOT's environmental programs, develops environmental policies, coordinates with TxDOT's districts on environmental issues, manages contracts and conducts environmental investigations.

He has a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Texas-San Antonio and earned a master's in information science from the University of Texas at Austin.

ANNICK BEAUDET – CITY OF AUSTIN, PROJECT CONNECT – MOBILITY OFFICE

Annick Beaudet, MPA, AICP has over 20 years of experience in land use and transportation planning. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Urban Geography from the University of Texas at Austin and a Master of Public Administration from Penn State. She led the update to the City's multimodal transportation plan through adoption in 2019. The Austin Strategic Mobility Plan laid the foundation for the successful Project Connect vote in 2020, Austin's \$7B public transit expansion program.

She has held positions in multiple City departments through her career in public service, including Bicycle and Pedestrian Program Manager and Austin Transportation Department Assistant Director. She currently serves as the City's Mobility Officer, leading the team at the City of Austin Project Connect Office supporting the Austin Transit Partnership and Capital Metro with Project Connect implementation. In 2023 she was nominated by the American Planning Association Texas Chapter for induction into the American Institute of Certified Planners National College of Fellows, the highest honor that can be bestowed upon an urban planner.

NADIA BARRERA-RAMIREZ – CAPMETRO, CROSS-AGENCY TRANSIT & MOBILITY PROGRAMS MANAGER



As the Manager for Cross-Agency Transit and Mobility Programs at CapMetro, Nadia Barrera-Ramirez works with a focus on data-driven results to make transit safer, faster, and more reliable. She manages the Transit Speed and Reliability Program at CapMetro, which works collaboratively with the City of Austin and TXDOT to build innovative infrastructure that not only prioritizes transit but incorporates bicycle and pedestrian movements. Additionally, CapMetro now operates and maintains MetroBike a public bike sharing system. Nadia and her team are leading CapMetro through a strategic planning effort to integrate public bike sharing into the transit network and to optimize operations of the bike sharing system. Prior to her time at CapMetro, Nadia was the City of Austin's Urban Trails Program Manager and encouraged active transportation through programming, education, and construction of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure.



FABIOLA BOWERS – CTRMA, TRAFFIC & INCIDENT MANAGEMENT MANAGER

Fabiola has over 10 years of experience in the tolling industry which includes enforcement and customer service. In her current role, Fabiola oversees CTRMA's Traffic & Incident Management Center which is responsible for actively monitoring real-time traffic cameras, traffic sensors and managing the variably-priced toll rate on the first and only managed lane facility in the Austin Region. 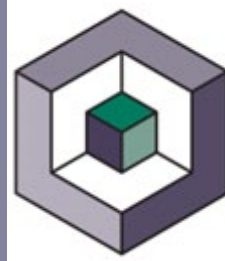
