

The WTS Houston Chapter's Mentorship Program is in its sixth year with eighteen mentors and mentees in this year's program. The program focuses on professional development and growth for all participants, mentors and mentees alike. Mentees and mentors were paired based on professional interests and career focus areas. Events included career development panels and monthly one-on-one lunches with mentors and mentees.

Highlighted events included discussions and panels focusing on specific professional development topics. In June, the Mentorship Program hosted a Career Panel which featured ReShane Dawn-Fowler (Ardurra), Anita Hollmann Matijcio (HGAC), and Giti Zarinkelk (Zarinkelk Engineering Services). The panelists highlighted the importance of work/life balance and setting boundaries with your boss and colleagues. In July, the mentees learned about Self-Advocacy and Salary Negotiation with a panel featuring Liza Amar (CDM Smith), Paula Ikpatt (HNTB), and Stephanie Anderson (Gradient Group). At this event, mentees learned tips to negotiate salary and how to increase their confidence in the workplace. In October, the final panel centered around project management with panelists Ashley Purkey (Halff), Blanca Obregón (TranSystems), and Brenda Bustillos (TxDOT).

Other events from this year included happy hour, small group meetings with multiple mentoring pairs, and an Escape Room. The program wrapped up in October an end-of-year celebration in November, including the program's alumni at William Price Distilling Company. Girls in STEM Conference

WTS Houston participated in GirlStart's annual **Girls in STEM** conference was held at Alief Taylor High School on Saturday, October 14th, 2023. STEM Committee Chair **Farah Anwar** led the effort and and was joined by chapter members Suzanna Set, Yvonne Hernandez, Fabiola Dagrin, Michel Maksoud, Youssaira Belmokadem, Tania Acosta, Marisol Ponce, Jenni Kimbell, Deepak Sampath Kumar and Robert Powers who volunteered to help.

We presented a workshop titled "*Exploring Roadway Elements: Intro to Transportation Engineering*," where students were given an overview of transportation engineering and introduced to two of the basic elements of roadway design: signage and pavement markings. Students learned about the various types of signs and pavement markings and the meaning, purpose, and importance of both. After the presentation, each student applied their understanding of these roadway concepts in two hands-on activities: an individual activity where each student matched the colors and words to the correct signs and a paired activity where students worked together to cut and paste the corresponding signage and pavement markings onto roadway scenarios that were laid out.

We presented two sessions during the conference – one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Each session was attended by 10-20 girls from $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ grade, otherwise known as Junior Explorers. Both sessions were interactive and hands-on. We kept the students engaged and involved throughout the sessions by asking questions and encouraging their participation by passing out traffic sign-themed stickers as well as mini traffic cones and construction hats as prizes. Their major take-aways were:

- Signs have code names (i.e. Stop signs are R1-1)
- Engineers must refer to manuals/codes like the MUTCD when placing signs and markings
- The shape and color of signs matter

Our second year in a row participating in the STEM conference was a success! Both students and volunteers enjoyed themselves and had a great time. A big thank you to all volunteers and to both WTS and GirlStart for their commitment to the next generation of women in STEM. We hope to keep supporting these initiatives by continuing to work with organizations like GirlStart in the future!

This year, the chapter awarded a total of five scholarships for a total of \$18,500.00 The TransportationYou scholarship was awarded to Sally Nguyen, a Senior at the Harmony School of Advancement, for her commitment to continuing her STEM education. Our collegiate award winners are committed to both maritime and roadway transportation. Three of these scholarships were awarded to students at Texas Southern University: Kameelah Muhammad, Dorimekka (Dori) Nichols, and Olajumoke (Lizzy) Omosebi. Molitoris Leadership Scholarship awardee, Kameelah, inspired by impacts to the supply chain during the pandemic, is pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Maritime Transportation Management and Security. Dori, who was awarded the Sharon D. Banks Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship, was recognized for her commitment to the transportation industry and desire to establish a business utilizing her commercial driving abilities. She is pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Maritime Transportation Management and Security. Jannet Walker-Ford Leadership Legacy Scholarship is given to a graduate student who demonstrates an interest in innovation in the transportation industry. WTS Houston awarded this to Lizzy, who holds both a bachelor's degree in Aviation Science Management and is working on a master's degree in Transportation Planning and Management. The Helene M. Overly Memorial Scholarship awardee, Disha Chatuvedi graduated from Texas A&M University this Spring with her master's degree in Urban Planning.

Chapter Awards are presented to recognize the companies and individuals who have made positive contributed to either to the Chapter or to the transportation industry in the Houston Michel Maksoud, PhD, PE region. The employer of the year, HDR fosters women leaders through career and leadership DFC development programs, as well as recruiting and mentorship initiatives. We appreciate their leadership within our Chapter and within our industry. This practice supports WTSI's mission to attract, sustain, connect and advance women's careers. Onvinve Akujuo of H-GAC was awarded Woman of the Year for her sponsorship of women and fostering their careers in transportation in all the organizations she has worked with. In her acceptance speech, she told us about the mentorship she received when she joined WTS in New York, and how that helped City of Houston her see other possibilities for her own career trajectory. The Honorable Ray LaHood Award, which recognizes men who advocate for the advancement of women within their own MEMBER OF THE YEAR organizations and the transportation industry, was awarded to Michel Maksoud, PhD, PE. The Rosa Parks Diversity Leadership Award was presented to Veronica Davis, P.E. to recognize her commitment to diversity and inclusion, celebrating both her contributions at the City of Houston and as co-founder of Black Women Bike in D.C. Veronica was additionally awarded the Rosa Parks Diversity Leadership Award by WTSI in May 2023. The Innovation Transportation Solutions Award was presented to **TxDOT** for the Regional Express Access Lanes (REAL) Plan, a forward-thinking look at future regional transportation needs and how addressing evolving multimodal transportation needs will ensure safe, equitable, flexible and efficient transit. Two WTS-Houston members were recognized for their contributions to the industry and to the chapter: Ashley Purkey, P.E., of Halff (2023 Young Engineer of the Year), and Thalia Gonzalez P.E. of Jacobs (Member of the Year).
