n behalf of the Board of Directors, the Scholarship Luncheon Committee, and our membership, we appreciate the support of our local WTS Chapter and, more importantly, our Scholarship Program and mission this year. The mission of WTS is to attract, sustain, connect, and advance women's careers to strengthen the transportation industry. This primary focus allowed us in November to award scholarships to four deserving students and celebrate some very deserving leaders in the region. These individuals are the current and future success of WTS.

In addition to these individuals, the reward for the board is that we lead a top performing chapter that consistently receives the Circle of Excellence honor and remain an invaluable asset to our local industry over the last 40 plus years now. We of course could not do it without the leadership of the WTS International Board and Foundation with three local leaders at the international level. The planning of the 2023 Scholarship Luncheon was led by Nicole Neeley of HNTB, and the board was extremely pleased with the committee's success this year.

As president, I would like to share the year in review by beginning with a shout out to our over 375 members of

WTS Atlanta reaching the largest membership in the history of the chapter by over 60%. We had a crazy idea for our 40th to increase our membership to 400 members after being around 200 for years, and we are roughly 25 away!!! We aimed to demonstrate this year that Membership has its benefits! Our corporate partners are the absolute best in the country. They not only support us with corporate dollars, but they also show up with leaders for programming and employees as volunteers in the chapter year after year. When we raised the bar last year to elevate our scholarship luncheon to an evening affair for our 40th Anniversary, our corporate partners not only met us at our increased sponsorship levels but exceeded our overall goal by 64% percent. This year, many returned without hesitation to support our chapter's growth by helping us to meet 100% of our fundraising goal before the end of the first quarter. We honestly can't do what we do without this support each year and for that, we thank each and every sponsor at every level, starting with our presenting sponsor HNTB.

I am more encouraged than ever with our progress this year on many fronts. If you haven't noticed, we have the most dynamic board in the 40-year history of WTS Atlanta. I am biased of course. Seventy percent of our board represents people of color with 40% of that representing African/African American 30% representing Transportation leadership should be as culturally diverse as its users...right? Thirty percent of our board leadership are thriving professionals at 40 years of age and under, so our board leadership spans about 30 years. The diverse generational perspectives keep us open and adaptive. Only fifty percent of our board leadership are engineers with the other half representing diverse non-engineering careers in our industry. We need our environmental

teams, our marketing proposal teams, our finance, contracts and business development teams as well for the industry to be fully supported and thrive. Lastly, as if our board isn't dynamic enough, 70% of us are working moms balancing careers and family while serving WTS Atlanta...showing younger professionals that women do have more options now.

We are reaching new heights in growing diverse membership as well! We are excited that our overall membership currently is more reflective of our dear city. In Q1 of this year we were at 33% people of color to 29% majority of those that disclosed. Now in Q4, we have grown to 38% people of color to 28% majority of those that disclose, which around 70% do. Where we need work is in increasing our male membership, which has remained pretty flat at 3% all year. We need more male membership. Women can't advance women alone. The goal is always to achieve more balance in the industry.

WTS Atlanta's programs have been dynamic under the leadership of our VP of Programs, Deborah Mobula. Our first event of the year was our membership kick-off event held at the SRTA/GRTA/ATL headquarters in downtown Atlanta and attendance was maxed out. Jannine Miller, our guest speaker, discussed how her previous role at GDOT and current role enables her to help bring all aspects of transportation effectively together. Special thanks to SRTA/GRTA/ATL for hosting our membership kick-off this year.

The Women of the Year Panel Discussion was priceless. Marsha Anderson Bomar, Chairwoman Lisa Cupid and Erica Parrish shared intimate detail and wisdom from their journeys in transportation and politics. This was a members-only event that was truly invaluable.

Members toured The National Center for Civil and Human Rights in February to study how significant the role of transportation was in the advancement of civil rights in America as well as stood together with other industry organizations for Transit Equity Day.

We were very thrilled to launch a Professional Development Series in April...and plan to incorporate more in 2024.

We had two key student engagement activities. For example, the Georgia Regional Future City Competition was addressing climate change in a city 100 years from now. Iris Ortiz, VP of Membership, served as a judge with multiple WTS members volunteering to make this program a success. Also, every year we take advantage of the opportunity to participate in ACEC's Introduce a Girl to Engineering at Kennesaw State, and our members always enjoy the competition as much as the girls.

WTS Atlanta Chapter was proud to host this year's International Conference with our local conference planning team under Chairs Malika Reed Wilkins and Regan Hammond. It was quite a lift, but we delivered exceptionally. We have had record attendance in the history of all WTS International conferences. We raised over \$100,000 locally, earning the chapter additional financial support for our collective efforts. The Blue Ribbon Commission Reception turned out to be an impressive list of transportation leaders. Our menu of tours and projects across our great city were of such interest that they sold out prior to the conference launch. Finally, what really warmed our hearts is that our very own Marsha Anderson Bomar, a WTS Atlanta charter member, won Woman of the Year for her contributions to the industry and WTS at the International level. It was truly an overall success.

And then the work continued with Board member Sherl White escorting a local future engineer to our nation's capital for the WTS International Capital Summit to learn all about the excitement and fulfillment of pursuing a career in transportation.

Finally, WTS Atlanta could not do anything without our transportation partners on the public and private side. You partner with us by contributing your dollars, your leaders, your volunteers, your knowledge and it helps move us all forward together. Thank you to GDOT and the State Transportation Board for showing up annually. Thank you to the ARC for hosting, Mobility Atlanta, Atlanta Beltline, The Hartsfield Jackson Atlanta International Airport, MARTA and the City of Atlanta ADOT for making the Multimodal Exchange a success. And thank you to our transportation partner organization COMTO for helping us to deliver the Prime DBE Mixer where we heard from top Primes and top DBEs on teaming successes and challenges.

It has been my pleasure to lead this great local organization. I hope our corporate sponsors see that their financial contributions are invested well. Thank you and we hope to aim higher in 2024.




