Sherl A. White: Senior Civil Engineer with Expertise in Design-Build Transportation Projects

### Path to Transportation

Sherl A. White's journey into transportation began in 1990, when she started her career as a structural engineer in Chicago, designing railroad and highway bridges. This foundational experience in structural engineering opened the door to managing large-scale infrastructure projects. Over the years, Sherl has expanded her expertise, specializing in Design-Build projects for the Georgia Department of Transportation since 2011. Her leadership on multibillion-dollar projects across the Midwest and Southeast has solidified her as an influential figure in the transportation industry.

### A Moment that Reinforced Her Passion

One defining moment in Sherl's career occurred early on when she had the opportunity to see her design work come to life and directly impact the public transportation system. As a young engineer, witnessing her designs be constructed and put into service was a profound experience that reaffirmed her passion for the work she does. Seeing the tangible effects of her work on the community made her realize how significant her contributions were and solidified her commitment to the field.

### Current Role in WTS Atlanta

Sherl has been an active member of the Women's Transportation Seminar for over 20 years, contributing to both the Chicago and Atlanta chapters. At the time, the field had few women in leadership roles, and the chance to take on a pivotal leadership position in this male-dominated industry was empowering. This decision not only accelerated her career but also reinforced her confidence in breaking barriers and thriving in spaces traditionally occupied by men.

Martika Johanson-Murray: Systems Engineer Passionate about the Intersection of Robotics and Transportation

### Path to Transportation

Martika Johanson-Murray's journey into transportation began in high school, where she became involved with WTS Atlanta through the Grady High School - TU Program. After graduating from SPSU/KSU in 2019 with a degree in Mechatronics Engineering, Martika began her career with Kapsch TrafficCom, specializing in Advanced Traffic Management Systems and transit projects. She also conducted research in textile material handling and collaborative robotics for a Fortune 500 company. Her passion lies in robotics and its potential to revolutionize transportation and intelligent systems.

### A Moment that Reinforced Her Passion

A turning point in Martika's career came when she transitioned from working on Advanced Traffic Management Systems to transit projects. Although initially uncertain about the shift, Martika quickly adapted and found fulfillment in seeing projects come together from start to finish. Witnessing the completion of a project after months of work deepened her appreciation for the positive impact these initiatives have on communities and solidified her passion for working in the transportation industry.

### Current Role in WTS Atlanta

This position is especially meaningful to her, as she was once a mentee in the same program. As Chair, Martika inspiring scholars at South Atlanta High School, and she is also involved in Community committee, connecting professionals throughout transportation industry to expand the organization's reach and support the next generation of leaders.

### A Moment She Felt on the Right Track



Martika felt truly unstoppable during a pivotal moment in her career when she faced challenges as the only female Systems Engineer in her office. Initially, building relationships with colleagues was intimidating, but over time, she grew more confident and integrated into the team. A significant moment came during a performance review when her male colleagues provided anonymous positive feedback, confirming that she was respected and supported. This experience helped Martika realize that, despite the obstacles, she had earned her place and gained the confidence to thrive in her field.

Amanda von Oldenburg: Shaping the Future of Transportation through Mentorship and Expertise

### Path to Transportation

Amanda's path to transportation began with a focus on hazardous waste management, where she worked for the USEPA cleaning up Superfund sites. After several years in that field, Amanda decided to shift her career toward a new challenge. She joined Atkins, initially applying for an Ecologist position, but her skills and interests in planning quickly led her into the transportation field. This transition sparked a new chapter in her career, where she has since become a trusted expert in transportation planning and environmental compliance, managing significant projects that positively impact communities and infrastructure.



One defining moment for Amanda occurred during a public meeting for a transportation project. An upset visitor voiced concerns about the project, and instead of avoiding the confrontation, Amanda embraced the opportunity to listen and provide clarity. By explaining the project's goals addressing concerns knowledgeable manner, she turned the conversation around. The visitor left the meeting grateful, saying, "This is the first time I've ever attended a public meeting and had a good experience." This moment reaffirmed Amanda's belief in the power communication and reinforced her passion for working in transportation, as she saw firsthand how effective communication can help build trust and support for projects.




