March 13, 2025 // Symphony Towers, Downtown San Diego



WTS San Diego and ITS California aim to foster professional connections between the organizations by partnering and hosting industry-focused events.

Kicking off the 2025 schedule of WTS San Diego program events, the Innovative Transportation Transformations luncheon took place at the University Club atop Symphony Towers. Featured speakers from SANDAG, CALTRANS, and the Port of San Diego joined the over 50 attendees. The presentations showcased innovative projects around San Diego and emphasized the incredible value of

partnership and collaboration throughout the project planning and implementation processes.

The first project highlighted was Harbor Drive 2.0 presented by Andrea Hoff (SANDAG), Aimee Heim (Port of San Diego), and Peter Eicher (Port of San Diego). This project is a multi-modal Corridor with dedicated Truck Lanes, Freight Signal Priority, Geofencing Truck Reservation, and a Zero Emission Vehicle Charging Truck Stop.

The second project was the Vesta Street Project presented by Margarita "Maggie" Nunez (Caltrans). This project has bridge and retaining structures, ramp widening, pavement rehabilitation and is a Navy partnership.

The Part-Time Transit Only Lanes - Bus On Shoulders project, presented by Karen Jewel (Caltrans), was the last project featured. This project had on-board technology and Pilot Program Findings that included driver feedback.


