

The WTS Southwest Ontario Chapter Scholarship aims to support the development of students in the transportation field by encouraging promising individuals to pursue careers in the industry. The scholarship is open to post-secondary students enrolled in degree or diploma programs related to transportation - such as planning, economics, engineering, political science, environmental science, or other relevant fields. To be eligible, applicants must be currently enrolled at an accredited college or university in Southwest Ontario, including the regions of Kitchener, Waterloo, Cambridge, Guelph, London, Windsor, and Hamilton. For full eligibility details, please refer to the Application Guide on page 4 and the website.

One (1) \$3,000 (CAD) scholarship will be awarded to one (1) undergraduate or graduate student. Previous WTS Scholarship recipients are not eligible.

The selection of the recipient will be made in June, and the successful applicant will be announced by July 1st, 2025. Recipient names and photos will appear in WTS Canadian Education Foundation (CEF) and WTS Southwest Ontario Chapter publications.

Applicants are advised that using AI, generative AI, or programs of such nature to fill out this form or any of the supplementary documentation to this application is strictly prohibited. Submissions found to be generated by such tools will result in immediate disgualification.

APPLICATION GUIDE

- 1. **Review the Scholarship Requirements**: Before you start your application, make sure you understand the <u>eligibility requirements</u> for the WTS Southwest Ontario Chapter Scholarship. The scholarship is open to individuals pursuing a degree or diploma in transportation or a related field, and applicants must be currently enrolled at an accredited university or college in the Kitchener, Waterloo, Cambridge, Guelph, London, Windsor, and Hamilton areas.
- Submission Deadline: Submit your application by June 1st, 2025, midnight (11:59pm ET). Make sure all required documents are included and carefully follow any additional instructions or prompts.
- 3. Understand the Selection Criteria: The WTS Southwest Ontario Chapter Scholarship is awarded based on several factors: your connection to the transportation industry, related activities and interests, a demonstrated commitment to advancing gender diversity in the field, leadership potential, strong character, academic performance, and relevant work experience. When writing your Personal Statement, keep these criteria in mind. Avoid generic statements be specific and detailed, using concrete examples to illustrate your qualifications.
 - 3.1. **Highlight Your Relevant Experiences**: Use the Personal Statement to discuss any transportation-related activities or interests you have pursued, such as research, internships, co-op positions, or volunteer work. The applicant should place greater emphasis on sharing their personal journey by demonstrating how their experience has made them come to appreciate the importance of promoting gender diversity in the transportation industry.
 - 3.2. Showcase Your Leadership Skills: The WTS Southwest Ontario Chapter Scholarship values individuals with strong leadership potential. Highlight any leadership roles you have taken on, such as leading a team project or volunteering for a transportation-related organization. Explain how these experiences have developed your leadership skills and how they will contribute to the transportation industry.
 - 3.3. **Connect Your Experiences to Your Future Goals**: In your Personal Statement, describe how your past experiences have prepared you for your future career aspirations. Share your long-term goals and explain how you plan to contribute to the transportation industry. Highlight how receiving this scholarship will support your journey and how you intend to use it to make a meaningful impact in the field.
 - 3.4. **Emphasize Your Passion**: Make sure to emphasize your passion for transportation. Explain why transportation is important to you and how you hope to contribute to its growth and development. Your passion should shine through in your Personal Statement, making it clear to the scholarship committee why you are a strong candidate for the WTS Southwest Ontario Chapter Scholarship.
 - 3.5. Edit and Revise: After drafting your Personal Statement, take time to carefully review and refine it. Check for spelling, grammar, and clarity, ensuring your writing is concise and well-structured. Consider sharing it with a friend, family member, or mentor to get constructive feedback and suggestions for improvement.
