

WTS Toronto Area Indigenous Student Scholarship

The Indigenous undergraduate student scholarship is open to any enrolled post-secondary school students with Indigenous heritage who are pursuing a degree or diploma in planning, economics, engineering, political science, environmental science, automotive and other programs that will lead to a career focused on transportation. Students are eligible if they are currently attending a college or university within Canada.

Two \$3,000 (CAD) scholarship will be awarded to the successful applicant. Award may be granted to a graduate student in the event that there are no qualified undergraduate student candidates.

Selection of the recipients will be made in October 2025, with a presentation of the scholarships in November 2025 at the Annual Event. Each recipient's name and photo will also appear in WTS publications. The successful students will also receive an invitation to attend the WTS Toronto Area Chapter Annual Event in November 2025 with some expenses covered by WTS.

Note: Winners may be asked to provide a second reference letter if they were chosen for the international awards

Personal Statement: (Max. 2 pages)</p> <p>Attach a <u>personal</u> essay that describes your interest in transportation, your career goals, and an explanation of why you believe you should receive the scholarship based on the scholarship's purpose of promoting the advancement of women in transportation. Please refer to the Application Guide on page 4.</p>
	<p>2. Letter of Recommendation: (Max. 1 page)</p> <p>Attach one (1) letter of recommendation from a previous teacher, professor, employer, or community leader (including Elder, mentor, or cultural teacher). The letter should address why you are a good candidate based on the noted scholarship criteria.</p>
	<p>3. Proof of Enrollment:</p> <p>Attach a copy of your tuition receipt or registration receipt.</p>
	<p>4. Transcripts:</p> <p>Attach a copy of your most recent transcript. If first year attach high school transcript.</p>
	<p>5. Proof of Ancestry:</p> <p>Provide proof of ancestry in one of several following formats: Indian status card, Métis Nation citizenship card, Inuit Trust Card or a letter from band or community representative, affidavit stating the reason why such documents cannot be attained.</p>

Application Guide

1. Review the scholarship requirements: Before you start your application, make sure you understand the [eligibility requirements](#) for the WTS Toronto Scholarship. The scholarship is open to anyone pursuing a degree or diploma in transportation or a related field, and applicants must be enrolled at an accredited college or university in Canada.
2. Ensure you submit by the submission deadlines, have included all required documents, and pay attention to any additional instructions or prompts.
3. Understand the selection criteria: The WTS Toronto Scholarship is awarded based on your connection with the transportation industry and any related activities and interests, demonstrable interest in the promotion of the advancement of gender diversity within the transportation industry, leadership potential and good character with consideration for academic performance and work experience. When writing your Personal Statement, keep the criteria in mind and provide examples that demonstrate your qualifications.
 - 3.1. Highlight Your Relevant Experiences: Use the Personal Statement to discuss any transportation-related activities or interests you have pursued, such as research, internships or co-op positions, or volunteer work. The applicant should place greater emphasis on sharing their personal journey by demonstrating how their experience has made them come to appreciate the importance of promoting gender diversity in transportation industry.
 - 3.2. Showcase Your Leadership Skills: WTS Toronto Scholarship values individuals with strong leadership potential. Highlight any leadership roles you have taken on, such as leading a team project or volunteering for a transportation-related organization. Explain how these experiences have developed your leadership skills and how they will contribute to the transportation industry.
 - 3.3. Connect Your Experiences to Your Future Goals: Your Personal Statement should explain how your experiences have prepared you for your future career goals. Discuss your long-term career aspirations and how you hope to contribute to the transportation industry. Explain how the scholarship will help you achieve these goals, and how you plan to leverage the scholarship to make a positive impact on the industry.
 - 3.4. Emphasize Your Passion: Lastly, make sure to emphasize your passion for transportation. Explain why transportation is important to you and how you hope to contribute to its growth and development. Your passion should shine through in your Personal Statement, making it clear to the scholarship committee why you are a strong candidate for the WTS Toronto Scholarship.
 - 3.5. Edit and Revise: Once you have drafted your personal statement, take the time to edit and revise it. Check for spelling and grammatical errors and ensure that your writing is clear and concise. Share your statement with a friend, family member, or mentor to get feedback and suggestions for improvement.
