July Lattes & Leadership

Doise Miers, Community Outreach Manager, Capital **Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO)**

At the July Lattes and Leadership discussion, Doise Miers shared her inspiring journey from tour guide to TxDOT to the Community Outreach Manager at CAMPO, emphasizing the importance of public involvement and community outreach in transportation planning. Her early work on the Trans-Texas Corridor and I-69 projects highlighted the importance of building trust with communities, particularly in areas where skepticism toward government agencies was prevalent. She emphasized the value of listening deeply to diverse perspectives, including tribal communities in East Texas and families of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, to shape more inclusive and responsive infrastructure planning.



At CAMPO, Doise led the evolution of outreach strategies, especially during the pandemic, when she successfully transitioned engagement efforts to virtual platforms while maintaining high levels of public input. She also shared practical advice for navigating community-designer conflicts, emphasizing the importance of early outreach, understanding local values, and maintaining transparency. She encouraged young people starting their careers to stay open-minded, ask questions, and embrace learning, reminding us that meaningful progress often begins with listening.



Doise's approach, grounded in flexibility, humility, and a willingness to ask questions, has set a high standard for public engagement. Her story is a powerful reminder of how technical projects benefit from human-centered leadership and meaningful community input.

at TxDOT. She rose through the ranks, tackling increasingly complex projects, including the Harbor Bridge in Corpus Christi, the South Padre Island second crossing, and Mobility35 Capital Express (CapEx). Now based in the Environmental Affairs Division, Sonya reflected on the power of mentorship and overcoming imposter syndrome, crediting



key figures—from a high school teacher to her TxDOT manager for helping her find confidence and purpose. Her story highlights the importance of leadership, trust, and advocacy in fostering resilient teams and achieving meaningful careers.




