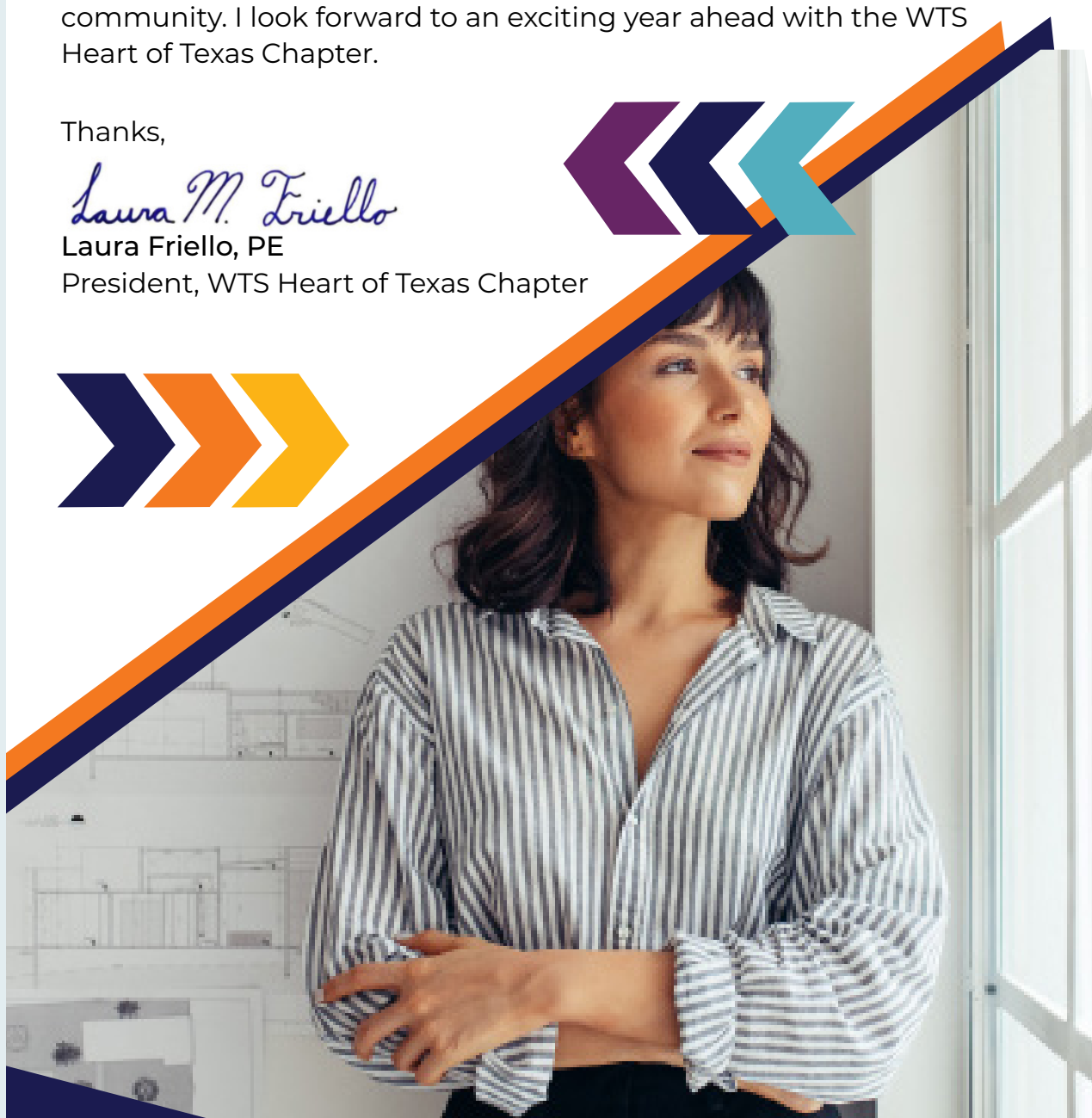

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October Luncheon

Ghizlane Badawi

Chief Executive Officer, Austin-  
Bergstrom International Airport (AUS)



The WTS Heart of Texas Chapter hosted an engaging October luncheon featuring Ghizlane Badawi, Chief Executive Officer of Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (AUS). Ghizlane shared the story of AUS’s remarkable growth and provided an in-depth update on the airport’s future plans. When the airport opened in 1999, it was designed for 11 million passengers annually. **By 2019, after adding nine new gates, AUS was already serving 17.3 million travelers—well beyond its roadway capacity.** The pandemic briefly slowed operations, but recovery was swift: by 2022, AUS handled 21 million passengers, and last year that number climbed to 22 million. This rapid growth prompted a revision of the 2040 Master Plan to meet growing demand.

Badawi emphasized that **AUS is not only a gateway to Austin but also a major economic driver for Central Texas.** The airport is entirely self-sustaining, funded through airport revenues and federal grants rather than local tax dollars. A 2018 study estimated AUS’s economic impact at \$7.8 billion, supporting more than 74,000 jobs—a figure expected to rise significantly as expansion projects progress. To keep pace with demand and enhance the passenger experience, AUS is investing in transformative infrastructure. Upcoming projects include **expanded queuing areas, new gathering spaces** with music stages and food trucks, and a **West Gate expansion** that will showcase local art and concessions. The Yellow Garage will **add 7,000 parking spaces** by 2027, and a new outbound baggage system will **increase capacity from 1,600 to 4,000 bags per hour**. Concourses M and B will **add 20 to 30 gates**, improving operational resiliency and expanding international service, while a redesigned Arrival and Departure Hall will streamline passenger flow and create a more efficient experience.

These improvements will position AUS as a **major hub serving 22 surrounding counties**, strengthening connectivity, boosting tourism, and attracting new businesses to the region. With an estimated \$5 billion investment and more than 13,000 contracting jobs anticipated, this expansion represents a significant opportunity for Central Texas. The luncheon offered an inside look at **how AUS is preparing for the future and how every decision is focused on creating an airport that reflects Austin’s unique character while meeting the needs of our expanding region.**

# November Luncheon

At the November luncheon, Susan Howard, TxDOT’s Director of Public Involvement, was joined by Abby Tomlinson to deliver an in-depth presentation **highlighting TxDOT’s continual-improvement approach to public involvement and the tools, guidance and innovations that support it**. The speakers walked attendees through TxDOT’s “origin story” for public involvement, which frames the department’s commitment to early, continuous, transparent and accessible engagement. They introduced the statewide PI team’s role in providing consistent strategies, best-practice guidance, templates, outreach materials, and hands-on support to districts. Core components of the **Strategic Public Engagement Guidance (SPEC) were featured**, including the community research template, seven-step PI process, engagement checklists and solutions to overcome common participation barriers.

The presentation also spotlighted TxDOT’s growing library of resources for special populations, including **Spanish Communications and Guidance**, a new resource to support TxDOT in engaging with Limited English Proficiency Texans. They also showcased real-world, district-based success stories where community partner relationships, specific feedback descriptions, strong visual communication and closing-the-loop practices helped build trust and improve project outcomes. Attendees previewed elements of the Customer Innovation Plan, illustrating the department’s forward-looking path toward a centralized **PI Hub on [TxDOT.gov](https://www.txdot.gov)**, enhanced training offerings, new engagement success measurement tools, and potential applications of AI for accessibility, content development and quality control. Overall, the session demonstrated how **TxDOT is modernizing public involvement, strengthening statewide consistency, and creating a more informed, accessible, and community-responsive engagement program**.



# Brown Santa Event

Our year of membership events ended with a **two-part winter holiday event**: volunteering at the **Travis County Sheriff’s Brown Santa program**, followed by a happy hour at **Lustre Pearl East**. Thanks to the collective efforts of all our volunteers, Brown Santa will provide Christmas gift boxes to around **2,000 families in need in the surrounding Austin area**.

The Travis County Sheriff’s Brown Santa program is a non-profit organization sponsored by the Travis County Sheriff’s Office. The program assists families and elderly citizens in Travis County with gifts and food during the holiday season, primarily those living outside the city limits of Austin. All of this is possible with donations and support from local merchants and community members. **This community event is supported by the community, for the community**.

The event began at the Travis County Sheriff’s Brown Santa warehouse at 3:00 PM with volunteers armed with wrapping paper, tape, scissors, and holiday cheer.

To close out the event, the Chapter added an ornament with our WTS Heart of Texas Chapter logo to one of the trees at the warehouse photo space. With the significant number of volunteers, our organization was able to provide numerous deserving families and children in our community with the joy of receiving Christmas gifts this year!
