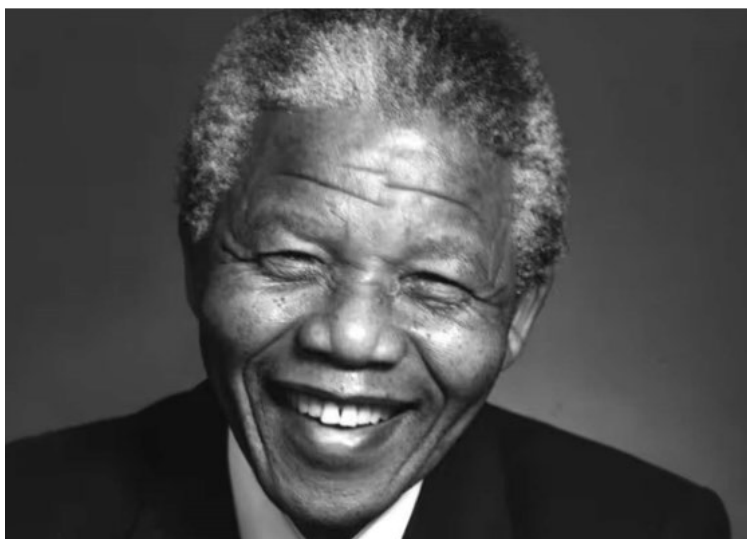




DEI IN MOTION
